# WORLD TRADE CENTER

*Dedicated to the victims -- rest in peace*

Before their destruction by two hijacked airliners on September 11, 2001, One World Trade Center (North Tower) and Two World Trade Center (South Tower) were the centerpiece of a massive, seven-building office and retail complex on a 16-acre site in lower Manhattan, New York City. The WTC housed 50,000 office workers and had as many as 70,000 visitors per day. The attacks destroyed or irreparably damaged all seven buildings with great loss of life.

**Owner:** Port Authority of New York and New Jersey

**Architects:** Minoru Yamasaki Associates, Rochester Hills, Michigan, and Emery Roth & Sons, NYC

**Engineers:** Worthing, Skilling, Helle, and Jackson, Seattle (structural); Joseph R Loring & Associates, NYC (electrical); Jaros, Baum and Bolles, NYC (mechanical); Port Authority of New York and New Jersey (foundations)

**Construction:** Excavation began in Aug 1966 and the WTC was dedicated in April 1973. Tishman Realty & Construction Co, NYC, was construction manager for the \$1.3-billion project.

**Design and Materials:** North Tower (1,368 feet) and South Tower (1,362 feet) were the tallest buildings in the world at completion. They were 110-story, steel-framed, tube buildings with aluminum facing and 70-ft deep foundations. Each tower had 21,800 windows and 4.8-million square feet of floor area. Over 200,000 tons of steel and 425,000 cubic yards of concrete were used in construction of the complex.
