Other summer events touched on during the meeting were our August Car Show at Elhart Pontiac in Holland, and the 28th Street Cruise on August 25th (a Saturday).

Todd Johnson was our guest speaker, talking about cleanup tips and products for our cars, trucks, bikes, and other toys. Perhaps one of the most useful tools to remove scratches, brake dust, sap,

and other contaminants from our paint is a clay bar. Todd said to use the medium grit, or the purple bar. They aren't cheap at \$22, but they will make your paint look \$2200 better! Use Final Inspection compound afterwards. Todd recommends Car Brite for washing a car. For cleaning carpets, use Car Brite Extra Duty. Car Brite's Melco Carnuba Wax is a premium wax that leaves no dust and no swirl marks, which is great on dark painted surfaces. Also, use diapers instead of terry cloth to wipe off the wax. When washing the diapers, DON'T use softener in the washer or drver! "Super Coat" (another Car Brite product?) cleans vinyl and rubber parts. It dries, so it doesn't leave the oily look like other products. For glass, use newspaper to wipe off the glass cleaner. We'd like to thank Todd for all the great tips!

Our membership lottery rose to \$110, but to win it you have to attend the meeting! Well, Fred Murphy's name was pulled, but he wasn't there, so the pot rolls over to next month!
