I'm a Senior Research Scientist and Lecturer in Ecology and Conservation Biology at the University of Szczecin (Poland), specializing in conservation genetics, molecular ecology and theriology. My academic research focuses on the conservation genetics of the critically endangered European mink (*Mustela lutreola*) and different aspects of a biological invasions, mainly related to small and medium carnivorans in Europe. I completed a Master of Science in Biology, at the University of Szczecin, and in Biotechnology, at the West Pomeranian University of Technology in Szczecin, and eventually moved on to a Doctoral Degree in Biology, at the Jagiellonian University in Kraków. Since 10 years I have been working on cross sectoral projects focused on nature conservation and environmental protection, integrating different groups of stakeholders – NGOs, scientific institutions, policy makers. I am the President for the Polish Society for Conservation Genetics LUTREOLA and the Coalition Clean Baltic.
