Improved angles/distances Consistency

Allows BU's to be ahead of the play Compensates for SP/FP player & umpires physical abilities

Topic 2: Secondary Position Movement Philosophy

Movement away from primary position to an area an umpire should attain to observe any subsequent play.

NOT automatic movement Should have all elements to constitute movement

Umpires thinking, not going to an "X" Allows umpires better angles/distance Allows umpires to not miss/late in rotations (3 umpire system)


Topic 4: Starting Position for BU's







Topic 7: Going for Help Philosophy

1. Make the Call based on the information you have.

Why do we ask umpires to make a call even though they may not have the best/unobstructive view?

Consistency Different umpire responsibilities Proactive- teach how to get in better position to see.



Topic 8: "In the Slot"

Prior to going set in which they are behind the catcher, line up your ear closest to the catcher with the inside corner of the plate, outside the perimeter of the strike zone.

Additional parameter to
line up in correct slot
Not just about the lead
foot stepping in
Allows umpires to see the
strike zone unobstructed



Topic 9: Philosophy of chasing a line drive and a fly ball

This is philosophy of decision making.

Difference between line drive & fly-ball?



Topic 10: PU Covering 3B (timing & movement)

2016: "position 10-12 ft from 3B at a 90 degree angle"

2017; As the lead runner approaches 2B, move toward 3B to first obtain the proper angle, then close your distance as the play develops working to get an unobstructed view of the play and obtain a final calling position of 10-12 ft from the play.

Topic 11: Utilizing holding zone on play at 3rd

2016: "move towards the holding zone in foul ground about $\frac{1}{3}$ the way to 3B"

2017: "move out from behind the plate towards the holding zone ½ way to 3B in foul ground to an area where you have an unobstructed view of all four elements.

2017: "move out from behind the plate towards the holding zone ½ way to 3B in foul ground to an area where you have an unobstructed view of all four elements.

Topic 12: Tag up responsibility for PU at 3B

PU achieves the best angle and distance to have an unobstructed view of all four elements. PU's should first move off the line, then up the line. (If fair/foul is the priority, stay close to the line.)

Topic 13: Runner on base, BU's placement of hands when in the "Ready Position"

What is the main goal of the set position?

Comfortable position

Rise at end of pitch

Not locked, ready to move

Topic 14: What is the calling distance for a force play?

No closer than 18 feet, watching all four elements.

You may need to backup if the dynamics of the play dictate.

Adjustments (FP/SP)
