Sarah Ineson / Amy Coates:





Tiyamike News:

I was a primary school teacher in the UK for 26years, then working as a volunteer, I taught 1 year in Burundi before teaching crafts for four years in South Africa.

I have been working in Malawi for four years. In my first two years I assisted a small orphanage school twice a week and occasionally taught rural women to sew by hand. From April 2010-Dec 2010 I taught tailoring to street boys at the 'SamaritanTrust', seven kilometres outside Blantyre.


I met Will and Pam in mid 2009 while they were staying in Blantyre, and visited Tiyamike Mulungu Centre in the autumn that year. At Pam's request I returned to Bangula February 2010 to teach the women how to play with the pre-school children. It was an enjoyable though very busy three weeks, building, threading, weaving, sand-play, water-play, songs and games. In the afternoons I taught Standard 8 pupils to sew. They made bags for themselves and dolls for pre-school. Some evenings I showed the night shift ladies how to sew small shorts.

For 10 months I was also overseeing the baby House in Blantyre for Will and Pam. A young Malawian couple have taken over that responsibility.

When I return to Malawi at the end of Sept this year, I will be based in Bangula at Tiyamike. I believe my work at first will be to support the work of the Early Years. Working alongside the teachers to develop a stimulating learning environment for the children. I also have a passion for teaching crafts to older children and adults. Bangula is a poor, rural area and teaching skills to people will help them to develop small businesses and provide for the needs of their families.

This is a step of faith for me, but I believe that all that I have done in the past is a preparation for what is to come. The Lord Jesus has given me love for the children and I'm very excited about the future. The heat, mosquitoes and distance from Blantyre will be a challenge but I know Jesus Grace will be enough.

I would value prayer about my move there in October, for a quick adjustment to the heat, good health and wisdom in all I do, and most of all a deeper knowledge and love of the Lord Jesus.



Blantyre Baby House

Please pray for wisdom for Pam and Will in this time of transition - the Baby house project is on hold due to some government red tape. Please pray for meetings happening early December as well as a new location in Blantyre that is bigger and more suitable for new babies to arrive.

Thank you, Jesus, for a great team and for the many hands to help and hug those precious children!

This is the plan for the first village, with its Meeting House,' family' houses and importantly a garden p

houses and importantly a garden plot for each family to grow their own produce. The football pitch and play area are also very important and altogether create a Community feel. The update so far is that the land is bought, and the lease will hopefully be going through.

First things first – the bore hole is dug and there is plenty of good water. Praise God. This is wonderful as it waters the land as well as services the folk. Before all the building is done Pam and Will hope to make use of the land by planting maize and putting a temporary dwelling for a guard/farmer. They have a trusted Malawian pastor who will oversee the cropping of the property—let's pray for an extra fruitful harvest!

Please pray for the lease to finalize and for funds to come in as we plan to invest into the future of our precious children and staff.

A couple from Saskatchewan arrived in September for 4 months to help and join the TMC team. The children also enjoy the company of 2 young ladies from Scotland / UK who will be staying for one year.
