

GERHARD W. STING

1915-1994

Gerhard W. Sting, 79 of Sibley, died Wednesday morning, Aug. 10, at Hills & Dales Hospital, Cass City, following a lengthy illness.

He was born at Bush on March 22, 1915, the son of Theodore and Rose (Schweitzer) Sting.

He was married to Dolores A. Goll in Immanuel Lutheran Church, Sibley, on Nov. 1, 1944, and she survives him.

He served in the U.S. Army during World War II.

Mr. Sting had been a milk hauler for Michigan Production Dairy in Sibley for several years, and later was custodian of Immanuel Lutheran Church and School for 23 years, retiring in 1980. He was a member of Immanuel Church and Sibley VFW Post 4115.

Surviving are his wife Dolores of Sibley, one son and daughter-in-law, Roger and Lynda Sting of Alameda, CA, one daughter, Valerie Sting of Hallendale, FL; two sisters, Nore Schram of Detroit and Mrs. Arnold (Adams) Becker of Unionville, one brother, Waldo Sting of Unionville, and several nieces and nephews.

One brother, Milton Sting, preceded him in death.

The funeral service took place Saturday morning, Aug. 13, in Immanuel Church, with Rev. Martin Hegener officiating. Burial was in the church cemetery. Graveside committal services were held under auspices of VFW Post 4115, Sibley.
