





- Added robust teacher resource library and revamped student page







































Advanced High School Accounting: History

- The Pathways Commission and AICPA have worked with the College Board on acceptance of a high school AP course in accounting.
- Submitted an AP course curriculum, an assessment test, a turn-key high school teacher training program and considerable data on the need and benefits.
- Course has been piloted in a number of states successfully.
 - 500+ high schools indicate they would offer the course
 - 126+ universities would support AP

1,000+ teachers are trained or in the process of being trained to teach the course

Advanced HS Accounting: The Path Forward

- College Board Update not accepting new AP courses for consideration at this time
- Options considered by a task force in January 2016
- Decision was made to move forward with Accounting Pilot & Bridge Project support



Summer 2016 Strategy & Results

- AICPA supported growth and reach of the Accounting Pilot & Bridge Project
- AICPA collaborated with:
 - Interested & High Impact CPA State Societies
 - Department of Education Representatives
- Summer 2016 5 training sites with 6 states (AL, KS/MO, KY, TN, TX):
 - 71 total teachers trained
 - 46 new teachers 25 repeat teachers

Recent Research: Honors/AP Support

- Nearly one-quarter (21%) of high school students have so far taken an accounting course in high school and roughly one-quarter (23%) plan to take an accounting course – adding to almost half coverage (44%).
- Honors and advanced placement courses receive relatively high levels of interest from high school students 40% and 39%, respectively.


What's Next: Advanced HS Accounting

What's Next: Advanced HS Accounting

- Beginning to implement 2017 strategy:
 - Scheduled 14 trainings with 20 state societies
 - Using 2016 filmed training as a refresher video for those who have already completed the program
 - Filmed March 2017 training
- Ideally work with State Societies and DOEs to establish Honors classes where possible
- Developing a sustainable model outside AP, if necessary
- Create additional resources for trained teachers
