Vice President's Message:

As we prepare for the March 3rd Association meeting, a big thank you to all who attended our informational meetings and the February Association meeting. Your questions, thoughts and input were greatly appreciated. I hope the time spent with Robert Todd, our attorney, helped you in making decisions about the proposed declarations, some of which hold higher importance than others and are:

Article V, Covenant for Assessments: Our attorney mentioned this is the single most important declaration needing an update as we currently have no way to protect the Association in the collection of the annual assessment if a property is abandoned as we have experienced in the past.

Article VII, General Provisions, Section 3, Amendments: This is extremely outdated and would change the percentage of voting requirements for amendment changes from 75% to 66 2/3% bringing us in line with current Florida Statute 720 governing homeowners associations.

Article IV, Rights and Obligations of the Association, Section 6, Conveyances, Sales, Rentals, Leases and Transfers: This amendment was submitted to us by Attorney Todd to bring us in line with current laws and statutes. It took several times reading it through initially for me to understand! Again, our Attorney is trying to protect us as homeowners from all possibilities in carrying out any of these actions.

Personally, I would like to thank each and every homeowner for your participation in reviewing, giving careful consideration of each item and voting on these proposed declarations. If you have voted by proxy or if you attend and vote at the March Association meeting, your participation is greatly appreciated.

Hospitality:

We have 4 homes for sale in our park and sales are pending on 3 of them. This shows how nice and marketable this park is. I will publish the new owners' names as soon as closing is scheduled.

Please keep everyone in your prayers. We have so much cancer and illness in our park this year. If you are sick, please be considerate of others and stay home from events until you are well. Thank you.
