Dear Parents & Carers,

What lovely weather we have been enjoying; long may it last! The

children have loved being outside and many teachers are making as many opportunities as possible for them to enjoy the outside for learning.

Gentle Reminders

Please can I remind parents/ carers to send the children in with named sunhats and suncream. We now have purchased some larger, purple sunhats for our older children. Both styles of sunhat can be ordered via the school gateway system. If you purchase a hat, this will be named, and issued directly to your child.

Due to our safeguarding policy, we encourage all of our children, including those in Nursery, to apply suncream independently. Of course, adults are on hand to assist if required, but it is important that children learn how to do this.

Children in the upper part of the school are finding, on the very hot days, that packed lunches can become quite unappetizing once cheese or ham etc...becomes hot. Please can you ensure that packed lunches have a freeze block in them to help keep food cool.

As you will be aware, children in key stage 2 are not entitled to free fruit at snack time. We are finding that we have a number of key stage 2 children who are complaining of feeling hungry at this time of the day (10.30am). Please could parents/carers provide a piece of fruit for their child?

We are also finding a small number of children are still complaining about feeling hungry after they have eaten everything in their lunch boxes. We encourage the children to tell their parent/ carer if they don't have enough food at lunchtime; however, this may have been forgotten by the time they reach home!

It is lovely to see mummies and daddies catching up with each other at the end of the school day. Please can we ensure that children are supervised whilst conversations take place? There have been some occasions when children have been running around/ scooting across the car park and of course our concern is that a car will drive in and knock a child over.

I have many parents requesting time out of school for their child in order to go on holiday. Most of you will be aware that it is illegal to take your child out of school during term time. Research has demonstrated the negative impact it has on children at the time but also the long-term impact. I understand that the cost of holidays during term time can be significantly lower, as teachers, we experience this all the time and are just as frustrated, but please do think of the impact on your child. It is precious time that cannot be made up.

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Taster sessions

Year 4 enjoyed an afternoon experiencing different musical instruments, reception class through to Year 3 enjoyed a cricket taster, and all of the children from reception to year 5 have enjoyed some yoga sessions as well as taking part in a sport festival within the school.

Homework

You will all now be familiar with homework that teachers send home.

There is the daily homework of flash cards, spellings and reading as appropriate as well as the mental maths skills that are so important for children in accessing maths: times tables, doubling and halving, number bonds etc...

The normal routine is a piece of English and maths homework is set each week and the children have approximately one week to complete it. At times, teachers may send a number of pieces of homework to be completed over a number of weeks, a heavier weighting of homework one week to another or a focus on a particular subject rather than different subjects. Homework is determined by what has been taught, is being taught or will be taught in the classroom depending on the subject.

Family Disco

I have been approached by a family at the school who has asked whether the school could become involved with raising money for a family member who is seriously ill. The little girl is eight years old, is very poorly and is running out of NHS options in terms of treatment and medication. Having discussed this with staff, we thought we could support by holding a 'family disco' after half term when the children and family members could pay a small amount to attend and have a hot dog tea (parents could purchase a hot dog as well if they wanted!). If anyone can make a donation for a raffle please do let me or the School Office staff know; we hope to receive enough donations for this to take place. The disco will be held on Friday 6th July 6pm – 7.30pm, further details will be emailed after half term.
