

#### Introduction

Today begins the high holy days of the Christian year. This Holy Week begins now with the Procession of Palms and will end on Easter evening. Our worship this week is filled with drama. The church is in continuous worship all week long. The various services are designed as if they are one long service with many parts. Not all elements of worship are contained in each day's service, such as the confession and forgiveness, the sermon, or communion. Some elements of worship only occur during these days such as the foot-washing, the procession with the Cross, or the words at the Vigil. There will be no benediction or postlude between Palm Sunday and Easter as we take time to go home, eat, sleep, work, go to school and then resume our worship each day. Welcome, to this Holy Week! There will be no spoken announcements this week or Easter morning. Please be attentive to notes in the bulletins.

Today, the first and second readings and psalm are the same as they are every year: Christ emptying himself of divine power and protection, willingly becoming vulnerable to those who struck him and put him to death. With Christ we lament his suffering and all human suffering, but we expect God's final vindication. Mark's passion story begins with an unnamed woman anointing his head, perhaps to proclaim him Messiah, and Jesus saying she has anointed him beforehand for burial. Mark's Easter story will begin with women going to anoint Jesus for burial, only to find that he has been raised, God's living Anointed One.

We welcome all to worship today. If you are a newcomer, we invite you to sign our guest book so we can greet you more fully. If you have questions about the service, please ask one of the ushers or those sitting around you.

# Holy Saturday, March 31

## 6:30 pm The Vigil of Easter

Traditionally this service begins at 10 or 11pm and concludes well after midnight. It includes an extended time of waiting in the dark for the resurrection around many readings and baptism. The forty days of Lent were a time for those who were preparing for baptism at the Easter Vigil to prepare themselves to join the Christian community. After the baptisms, Easter would be announced, bells would ring and then the congregation would celebrate the first eucharist of Easter. A festive reception would follow worship to break the Lenten fast. That's the tradition and you can find congregations in the Columbia area who will be doing this full Vigil.

However, we will be doing our own local version of this special service.

We will gather at 6:30 around the new fire of Easter near the church graveyard. We will process with the Paschal Candle into the darken church (which represents the tomb of Christ.) There we will wait as the Easter proclamation is chanted, as we hear several readings from the Old Testament and as we affirm our baptism. Our service will end with this affirmation and will conclude on Easter morning with the announcement of Easter and the singing of a Hymn of Praise.

On Easter morning, please bring: a few flowers to place in the Easter cross outside the church and a bell to ring during worship.




