"Christianity in Action"

"...let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven." ---Jesus, in Matthew 5:16

A Pew Research Center survey found that between 2001 and 2016 the percentage of Americans who think that religion plays an important role in solving social problems fell from 75% to 58%. Another survey found that half of Americans think that the government could replace religious organizations with no problems and nothing lost. Indeed some of the headlines and news stories--- not all--- might give the impression that the federal government is primarily responsible for the relief and recovery efforts taking place in Texas and Florida and Puerto Rico and the American Virgin Islands.

The National Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (NVOAD) is an umbrella group for disaster relief organizations. The CEO, Greg Forrester, says, "About 80% of all recovery happens because of non-profits, and the majority of them are faith-based." The vast majority of those are Christian. These organizations work in conjunction with FEMA, the Federal Emergency Management Agency, but the organizations provide volunteers, food and practical assistance.

Seventh Day Adventists specialize in disaster "warehousing." Bottled water, diapers, clothes and other materials will probably pass through their hands before they reach the people in need. The Convoy of Hope specializes in providing food, water and sanitary supplies. Samaritan's Purse has crews and trucks that deal with debris removal and cleaning up houses. It also has contracting services which help the needy to rebuild their homes. Samaritan's Purse has already responded to 20 disasters this year.

The United Methodist Committee on Relief is known for its expertise in "case management." The organization has work crews that clean houses and have trained volunteers who help families deal with FEMA assistance, state aid programs and private insurance. The Southern Baptists are strong in the regions affected by the recent hurricanes. They have 1550 mobile units, many of which have been tasked to these areas. These units provide feeding, chain-saws, mud-out, command, communication, childcare, shower, laundry, water purification, repair/rebuild, and power generation. The Salvation Army is also engaged. The Billy Graham organization has sent many of its 2300 crisis-trained chaplains to provide emotional and spiritual support to the victims of the hurricanes.

We evangelicals can be proud that Christians are shining their lights in these places affected by natural disaster. Christians are making a positive contribution to a hurting world in practical ways. Perhaps some of you would like to make a financial contribution to one of these relief agencies. Perhaps someone would also like to offer their time and talent to one of these groups. - Pastor Kurt
