



Simple Prayer Life By Vern Deadmond

I have been wanting to write on the subject of prayer for some time now. A couple of months ago, I had composed an article on prayer, but as I was finishing it, I had an uneasy and unsatisfied feeling about it. I felt it wasn't inspired by the Holy Spirit at all, so I never submitted it for the newsletter. The things I write for the newsletter are borne out of revelation from God's Holy Spirit during my personal study time and fellowship with God and I want to share with all of you what God shares with me. If the words I share are not inspired by God's Holy Spirit, they are dead words and I know they will not encourage you. Last week as I was reading my Bible, there was a particular scripture that jumped out at me, "Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth..." (Ephesians 6:14)

God's Holy Spirit began to speak to me as I read this. Over the years, I have heard many teachings on "putting on the armor of God." The teachings focused on the symbolisms of the armor, what each part related to. But as I listened to God's Holy Spirit, I got more excited. The Scriptures that followed all related to our relationship with God through His Word. You must understand that without the Word of God in your life, there is no relationship with God. Consider and meditate for yourself on these Scriptures starting in verse 14 and ending with verse 18. As you meditate on these, think about what the words mean. "Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth, having put on the breastplate of righteousness, and having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace; above all, taking the shield of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one. And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God; praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints..." (Ephesians 6:14-18)

Paul is concluding his letter to the Church at Ephesus here, and you are being told to take a stand against your enemy and his manipulations, "To be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might" (Ephesians 6:10). Who is your enemy and who is not? It is the devil, not those that he works through. Take a stand against the devil with the power of God. Paul is saying you need to have the truth of God's Word firmly established in yourself, know that you are righteous regardless of what your mind thinks, you have to prepare to stand, you need to be built up in faith, you need to protect and renew your thoughts to align with God, and pray with all types of prayer with the Word of God. Paul describes the Word of God as a sword, and when you are praying, speak God's Word into the situation, exercising your authority as a born-again believer.

Again, your relationship with God must include the Word of God, Jesus Christ His Son. His Word has to get down in your heart, this is where it will be nourished and from there the Word will be able to produce results (fruit) in your life. Your weapons available to you as you stand against the devil are awesome, but remember they are spiritual weapons. Listen to Paul, here in 2 Corinthians 10:3-6, "For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to the flesh. For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds, casting down arguments and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, bring every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ, and being ready to punish all disobedience when your obedience is fulfilled."

Wielding the Word of God in your prayers will cut the devil off at his knees, it will hack his arms off, render him ineffective against you. How do you imagine the devil? Is he some red skinned large demon with horns protruding from his head with an evil appearance, holding a pitchfork? This is an image created by man. There is not one scripture in God's Word that describes the appearance of the devil in this manner. When you know God's Word, you will have the proper image of who the devil is, and you have authority over him to rebuke and resist him. First of all, the devil is a spirit, he does not have a body of his own. This is why he has to find a body that will give him permission to operate in. I'm not talking possession; I'm referring to people submitting to the devil and allowing him to use them. The devil comes at us through people. When this happens, instead of adding fuel to a verbal confrontation with people, take authority over the situation in prayer. Jesus told us, "And I will give you the large of the language of liceavan, and whatever you blind on earth will be bound in freavan, and whatever you large on earth will be loosed in liceavan." (Matthew 6:19)

As a born-again believer, you have been given the authority in the spirit realm, you only need to speak with your authority over the devil, as James 4:7 says, and "Submit to God, resist the devil and he will flee from you."

As the Word of God becomes a part of your relationship with God, you will find your old way of thinking changes once the truth of God's Word becomes entrenched and established in your heart. The truth of God's Word never changes, and it baffles me when Christians consider God's truths as political issues. A politician is constantly compromising his or her beliefs to achieve their agenda. Christians ought not be compromising God's truth. For years, the world has compromised the truth in regard to abortion, racism and, homosexuality. In these last days before Jesus returns, we see where the Church has compromised so much with the world that even many Christians have been deceived and support these lies. As a Christian, the truth should determine where you stand on these topics. Settle in your heart, "The entirety of Your Word is truth, and every one of Your righteous judgments endures forever." (Psalms 119:160) God has not

changed His truth from the beginning, and His truth is absolute. It is critical for you as a Christian, to have God's truth established in you as you make prayer an intricate part of your relationship with God. Paul describes the Word of God as the sword of the Spirit, and you are to incorporate the Word of God in your prayers.

One person I have read about that exemplifies how prayer works in your relationship with God is George Mueller. He lived in England during the 1800's and is known most notably for the orphanage he started and operated. During his lifetime, he cared for more than 10,000 orphans and in his own words, this was accomplished "simply by prayer and faith." The means for establishing and running the orphanage was done by taking every need to God in prayer. He would take in the orphans, give them a Christian upbringing, and educate them, at a time in England when the workhouses depended on orphans for labor. He was criticized heavily for depriving these workhouses of much needed labor. He was asked in an interview, "What is the secret to your service to God?" His response was:

"There was a day, a day that I utterly died, died to George Muller, his opinions, preferences, tastes and will ... died to the world, its approval and censure ... died to the approval or blame even of my brethren and friends...and since then I have studied to show myself approved only to God. A servant of God has but one Master. The primary business I must attend to every day is to fellowship with the Lord. The first concern is not how much I might serve the Lord, but how my inner man might be nourished. Faith does not operate in the realm of the possible. There is no glory for God in that which is humanly possible. Faith begins where man's power ends."

This is why he was able to accomplish what he did, he put his relationship and fellowship with God first in his life. He stopped caring about what others would say or might say about him. The focus of his life was God. In his book, Release the Power of Prayer, he has some great points and I will share a few here with you:

- A life of prayer and meditation will render a vessel ready for the Master's use.
- Take God by His Word and rely on it, trust on it.
- Give yourself earnestly to prayer with respect to the thing you are asking and seeking God for.
- Stay determined in faith, look to God, listen to His voice as He encourages you to remain steadfast and not waiver.
- You are called to have simple confidence of faith in Jesus Christ.
- Your prayer life is to consist of persistently beseeching the Lord to send you the means that are necessary for those things you require.
- God delights in being earnestly asked and He takes pleasure in the continuance of prayer.
- Persevere with prayer in faith.
- Difficulties are overcome with prayer and faith.
- Pray boldly for the things you need.
- If you do not put pressure on God's Word through prayer asking God to fulfill His promises for your life; then you
 will never see His power manifested this way.
- You can have a good life through an intimate personal relationship with God, but you can have a great life by placing demands on God through prayer and faith.

Let's consider Daniel, who was a man of prayer. Some of you may only know the story of Daniel in the lion's den. What a great miracle, God closed up the mouths of the lions all night long, so Daniel was not supper for them. If you read the account in the Bible, you see that Daniel was a man of prayer. In *Daniel 6:10*, we read, "And in his upper room, with his windows open toward Jerusalem, he knelt down on his knees three times that day, and prayed and gave thanks before his God, as was his custom since early days." From this one Scripture, you see that Daniel was a man of prayer. It was his habit since the early days of coming to Babylon that he would set aside time to pray and fellowship with God. He went to his home, got alone with God and would spend time with Him regardless of what anyone thought or said about him. If Daniel lived today, I'm sure his friends would accuse him of being a fanatic, a zealot, and an extremist about Jesus. Have you ever considered, not only did his relationship with God save his life, but throughout Daniel's life in Babylon he had favor with the rulers of Babylon? First with Nebuchadnezzar, then with Darius, and finally with Cyrus. God will bring you into favor and goodwill with people of position.

Prayer is more than just petitioning God for those things you have need of, it is fellowshipping and talking with Him. All part of developing your intimate and personal relationship with Him, getting to know Him. And as you know Him more and more, you find yourself living the eternal life that Jesus has promised you here in John 17:3, "And this is classed life, that you may know Him, the only true God, and Jesus Christ who He has sent." God saving Daniel from the lions was a result of his relationship with God. Because he knew God, and he believed God; God protected Daniel and kept him from death. God will do the same for you, if you have set your heart to seek Him, to live for Him, to know Him and to believe Him. The responsibility to grow in this relationship is on each of us. And as you see from Daniel's example, his relationship with God included time spent in prayer.

Over and over in different environments, on programs on television, and even pastors have said, "The next chapters of life are yet to be written." Thankfully we all have a story and it's interesting how our stories aren't over until we enter eternal life, then the book gets bigger, the paper more expensive and precious to be used for our heavenly pages – our newness, for reals!

I, however, am here believing God speaks to us personally as He did to all the Bible characters – individually inspiring, directing, discipling, teaching, loving all the way through – even in the stages of discipline where it's easier to see only the pain or the struggles versus stopping to see our part in the situation and asking God an important question, "What may I learn in the trial, divorce, death of a loved one, imprisonment, loss of employment, death of a child, homelessness and so on?" Foot's Bible Study

Jeremiah 51:1-58

It is foolish to trust in man made images rather than in God. It is easy to think that the things we see and touch will bring us more security than God. But things rust, rot and decay. God is eternal. Why put your trust in something that will disappear within a few years? (51:17-19)

The people were paralyzed with guilt over their past. The Babylonian armies had desecrated the temple, and the people were ashamed to return to Jerusalem. But God told them to return to the city because He would destroy Babylon for its sins. (51:51)

In this last of Jeremiah's messages, we find again the twin themes of God's sovereignty and His judgment. Babylon had been allowed to oppress the people of Israel, but Babylon itself would be judged. Although God brings good out of evil, He does not allow evil to remain unpunished. The wicked may succeed for a while but resist the temptation to follow them or you may share in their judgement. (51:60-64)

Titus 2:1-3:15

Paul has written a letter promoting right teaching and doing what is good for all to learn. (2:3)

Women who were new Christians were to learn how to have harmony in the home by watching older women who have been Christians for some time. If you are of an age or in a position where people look up to you, make sure that your example is motivating younger believers to live in a way that honors God. (2:3-5)

If you want someone to act a certain way, be sure that you live that way yourself. Then you will earn the right to be heard, and your life will reinforce what you teach. (2:7-8)

Paul summarized what Christ does for us. We move from a life full of sin to one where we are led by God's Holy Spirit. All of our sins, not merely some, are washed away. Washing refers to the water baptism, which is a sign of Salvation. In becoming a Christian, the believer acknowledges Christ as Lord and recognizes Christ's saving work. We gain eternal life with all its treasures. We have a new life through the Holy Spirit, and He continually renews our hearts. None of this occurs because we earned or deserve it, it's all God's gift. (3:3-8)

Psalm 99:1-9

Everyone should praise God's great and awesome name because His name symbolizes His nature, His personage, and His reputation. But the name of God is often used so carelessly in conversation that we have lost sight of its holiness. How easy it is to treat God lightly in everyday life. If you claim Him as your Father, live worthy for the family name, respect God's name and Give Him praise by both your words and your life. (99:3)

For believers, God's holiness gives comfort because, as we worship Him, we are lifted from the mire of sin. As we believe in Him, we are made holy. (99:5)

Proverbs 26:17-27

Most of *Proverbs* to me should be common sense, this is not always the case. The parable of "Yanking a Dog's Ears" equates to getting bit. Likewise getting into the middle of an argument is a good way for the problem to become you. It's best to mind your own business but if you have to get involved wait until cooler heads prevail. (26:17)

Hello everybody inside and out!! If I was to ask you what are the three most powerful words you know? I would hazard a guess, off the cuff, that the response would be overwhelmingly, "I love you." Which isn't bad. But since it's Easter possibly some of the sharper marbles would have guessed, "HE HAS RISEN!" Bingo! That's a winner!!

Take a moment to think what if the words, "HE HAS RISEN!" had never been spoken, where would we all be? I would say there are probably more than a few that would no longer be alive, myself included. So, I'm thinking we should take a moment and reflect on what a powerful thing God has done for us by giving us His Son and through Him. The fact that "HE HAS RISEN" allows us to rest easy knowing that by turning our lives over to Him, we shall have the opportunity to rise as well. Happy Easter everybody!!

I want to go back to Paul's instruction to us in *Ephesians 6:18* where he tells us to "*Pray always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit.*" The term "*all prayer*" means all types of prayer, and this includes praying in tongues. I may have lost some of you right there. You may not believe in that, or you have not been introduced to praying in tongues before. The ability to pray in tongues is a supernatural gift from God. Let me remind you what *Psalms 119:160* says, "*The entirety of Your Word is truth, and every one of Your righteous judgments endures forever.*" If you are someone who does not believe in tongues, or you believe this gift from God has passed away, how do you reconcile this with *Psalms 119:160*? God's Word is the standard for judging your beliefs and thoughts. If what you believe or think does not align with the truth of God's Word, then you are the one who is wrong.

The Gifts of the Spirit have not ceased, they are available to each and every one of us through the Baptism of the Holy Spirit. You receive these gifts by receiving them. James 1:5-8 states, "If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all liberally and without reproach, and it will be given to him. But let him ask in faith, with no doubting, for he who doubts is like a wave of the sea driven and tossed by the wind. For let not that man suppose that he will receive anything from the Lord; he is a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways." All you have to do is ask God and believe Him for the Baptism of the Holy Spirit, receive it just as you would receive a Christmas gift from family or friends. The Baptism of the Spirit is the next best gift God has given you besides Salvation. It is the most powerful gift you have, and you need it to be able to live a victorious life now. The gift of the Holy Spirit was promised to us by Jesus in Luke 24:49. "Bahald. I sand the Prantise of My Pathar upon you; tarry in the city of Jarusalam until you are endined with power from on high. "Jesus is speaking of God's Holy Spirit here, and with the gift of the Holy Spirit, we receive power. Consider when Jesus told His disciples, in Matthew 28:19-20, they were to "In the matter and make disciples of all the nations, beptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of @@ @@... Take note though, Jesus told His disciples they were not to leave Jerusalem to fulfill their purpose until they had received God's Holy Spirit. Because without the Holy Spirit, they would be lacking the power to accomplish His will. You are not able to accomplish your purpose and fulfill the will of God in your life without the Holy Spirit's power. His awesome gift to you gives you access to God's mighty power. Today, if you have never received this gift of the Baptism of the Holy Spirit, will you ask God for it? You don't have to wait to have someone pray with you, you can pray to God right where you are and ask Him. If you do this, He is faithful and just and He will answer your prayer. You receive the gift of the Holy Spirit the same way you received the gift of salvation, you receive it by believing. Begin to pray in tongues, this is a prayer that cannot be messed up because it is coming out of your born-again, recreated spirit that is perfect before God.

You might be asking the question: how do I pray? Jesus gave us instructions that have been recorded in the Gospel of Luke. Luke 11:2-4, "When you pray, say: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us our daily bread. And forgive us our sins, for we also forgive everyone who is indebted to us. And do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one."

Without going into a great amount of detail here, Jesus is telling you to pray to the Father only, no one else. You don't pray to dead people or other spirits. Always honor and revere His name – Jesus. It is the name of Jesus, when used, that opens the kingdom of Heaven to you. Pray in faith for those things promised in His Word to be manifested from His kingdom into your life. His will is shown in His Word, so pray those things shown in His Word to be accomplished in your life. Just as the Hebrew people were provided for every day in the wilderness after leaving Egypt, you are to pray that God provides for you every day also. As you pray, be humble and not in pride, remember it is God's righteousness not your righteousness. But most importantly, forgive everyone who has done wrong against you – if you do not, this unforgiveness will hinder your prayers. And His final comment to you is to not entertain thoughts of sin, keep your mind and heart on those things that are good and lovely.

If you are unsure of what things to pray for, start with praying scriptures as David did. *Psalms 119:41*, "Father, let Your mercies come also to me, O Lord. And give me Your salvation as You have promised to me ... In Jesus name, Amen." is a great scripture that you can pray every day over yourself. If you pray this, do you know what you are praying? Asking for God's mercy is asking Him not to give you what you deserve. Asking for His Salvation is asking for His grace in your life – those things you don't deserve: healing, health, prosperity, joy, peace, etc... believe this prayer will come to pass in your life and speak it continually in your fellowship with God. I finish my prayer and fellowship with God with the Psalms 37:5, "Father, I commit my way to You O Lord, I trust also in You and I know You shall bring my petitions to pass."

There are two things you need every day in your relationship with God, to know Him and to pray and fellowship with Him. When you know Him through His Word, you have confidence that He hears your prayers and supplications. And when you know that He hears you, then you know and have the confidence that when He hears you, He will answer you. I will conclude with this final instruction and encouragement. You have a responsibility to do if you want to see the power of

God manifested in your life continually. You can't just sit back after you receive Jesus into your life and expect God to show up every time you have a crisis without fostering your relationship with Him. He never leaves you, but you were created for fellowship with Him. He loves you so much, but He will not force Himself on you. Become a fanatic for Him, pursue His love – for some of you it may feel like you're throwing yourself off a cliff (not literally please). If your friends in the world call you a freak, count it all joy, because the only thing that matters is that Jesus loves you! Pursue Him with all of your heart, pursue to know Him – you can have no relationship with Him apart from His Word.

A Lesson from Jonah That We Can All Learn Steve Arterburn

"But Jonah ran away from the Lord." - Jonah 1:3

I'm sure you're familiar with the story of Jonah and the whale (big fish!). The Book of Jonah in the Old Testament is a short book with just four chapters. If you have ten or fifteen minutes, stop, and read it through. It's a great story with a lot of lessons for us.

The thing that stood out to me about this story was that Jonah was bold enough, after hearing exactly from God what he was supposed to do, to intentionally do just the opposite. He got up and went in the opposite direction to get away from the Lord.

That stood out at first because I thought to myself, "What a fool! Who would do such a thing?" Then I realized that is what I've done time and time again in my own life. Haven't you?

Look back at the choices you've made to try to do things your way. Think about the nights you've laid awake with a knot in your stomach, full of fear and anxiety about things that most likely weren't going to happen anyway. Think about the times you've chosen to numb yourself with food, alcohol, drugs, sex, shopping, or something else that wasn't really the answer you were looking for or needed. When you "sobered up" you felt a little emptier than the day before.

What Jonah needed to do; what you and I need to do, is to humble ourselves and surrender our wills to God. It's a daily task that will grow a little easier the more you do it. Start today. Don't go through what Jonah went through. Learn from him.
