**NEW NHS 'TEST and TRACE' PHONE APP** – On the 24<sup>th</sup> September, the NHS began to roll-out its new Test and Trace phone app, which is for use on smartphones (with Bluetooth enabled). When you arrive at a venue you simply scan the Q.R. code near the entrance to record your attendance. If a notification is subsequently sent to an app user, it will not mention the name of the particular venue, just that the user has recently been to a place where they spent fifteen minutes or more, close to someone who has subsequently tested positive for coronavirus. Details of the privacy safeguards used are readily available on the internet. If you do not check-in with your phone at church, you will still need to do a manual check-in (i.e. name on a list).

**First Holy Communion:** The poor children who should have received their First Holy Communion last June, hopefully will receive Our Blessed Lord over the weekend of 19/20<sup>th</sup> December. Just in time for Christmas. On Saturday, 19<sup>th</sup> December'20 at 10.30am 18 children will receive their Holy Communion at Holy Family. Then on Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> December at the 08.45 am Mass at St Anne's two children will receive their Holy Communion. Please pray for the children and their parents.
