Share the Harvest

On the back of our weekly bulletin you'll find a box of "Vital Statistics" which records attendance and giving from the previous week. It also indicates that \$6,400 is needed per week to meet our general fund obligations, and if you've been following our vital statistics, you'll notice that we frequently fall short of what is needed. Thankfully, our church has traditionally lived within its budget so that by the end of the year, what we spend is less than what we budget. However, those efforts are not enough to make up for all our shortfall.

Our finance committee is projecting a \$30,000 deficit by the end of the year. You may be wondering what's included in that \$30,000 shortfall. Thankfully, it does not include our utilities, salaries, insurance, or programming expenses. All those have been paid on time throughout the year. However, one of the areas where we fall short is in paying our Conference apportionments which represents our denominational "overhead." It's what we pay because we are United Methodists, and it represents an important part of our witness to the world. For example, our apportionments sustain ministries such as the United Methodist Committee on Relief, which provides millions of dollars of aid in areas affected by natural disasters or poverty.

To meet all of our 2024 financial obligations, we are once again launching "Share the Harvest" to raise \$30,000. There are three levels within that goal: our "bronze goal" is \$10,000; our "silver goal" is \$20,000; and our "golden goal" is \$30,000.

Please participate in Share the Harvest by giving above and beyond your regular giving, whether that's an extra dollar or an extra \$100. It all adds up and it all helps us close the gap in our giving. Please mark your extra giving for "Share the Harvest" or simply, "Harvest." If you haven't given at all this year, or if you've given sporadically, anything you give may be marked for Share the Harvest.

We'll also be engaging in another spiritual practice in November by making our annual pledges to the church. When we prayerfully make our pledges to the church, we do so by faith, trusting that God will provide us with the means for us to take care of our homes, our families, and our church. Pledge cards will be sent out with our quarterly statements. Our pledge cards will also give you the opportunity to give toward our new roof. Cost for a new roof over the sanctuary will be \$47,550. So far, we have received \$3,400; the rest will be covered by a low-interest bank loan which we plan to repay within three years. Any money pledged toward the roof in excess of expenses will be designated for the building fund.

Please prayerfully consider how you might participate in our end-of-year "Share the Harvest" campaign and how you might support our church next year through our pledge drive.


We need sponsors!


