We all want to thank outgoing RRNA President **Lee Mays** for his service. Lee has assured me he will continue to be a resource in helping to keep our neighborhood a great place to live and play. Most importantly, he will be around to help me learn the ropes and keep things moving in the right direction.

At the moment, we have an opening for vice president on the RRNA board. Some big news to come out of the annual meeting was a warmly received update from **John Alvarez**, Vice President of the Royal Ridge Recreational Club (RRRC). This past summer's membership drive brought in 50 new families for 2017-2018, which is a welcome turnaround in terms of growth for the pool.

**Diana Luna** and the recreational club folks also recognized **Bob Robbins** and **Ernie Jones** before the residents at the meeting for the volunteer work both men have done around the clubhouse grounds. Plaques were presented to each. Bob also deserves added thanks for all the hard work he puts into making the National Night Out event a success.

Our RRNA website www.royalridgesa.org has

been gathering a lot of traffic indicating increased interest in our community. This year, the average number of site visitors was 971 per month, but for the month of September we had 1,588 visitors. We plan to add a Facebook page soon to complement the social media presence enjoyed by the Royal Ridge Recreational Club. I will have an update on that project next month.

#### **COMMUNITY CAT PROGRAM**

Most folks are not aware that San Antonio has a Community Cat Program (CCP) that will spay/neuter and vaccinate the feral/stray/community cats of San Antonio. They received a grant from PetSmart. The website of Animal Care Services (ACS) states certain zip codes can use this grant, but right now the CCP coordinator has opened this program to all of those living in the City of San Antonio. With that being said, it is the perfect time as a community to do TNR in our neighborhood. What is TNR? It is humanely trapping the cats, taking them to ACS, and having them spayed/neutered and vaccinated. Why should we Trap/Neuter/Return (TNR)? Why not remove them instead? Because removing them creates a vacuum effect, where other's will move in and take over their territory. TNR is the best way to control the over population of feral cats. The CCP phone number is 210-207-6696. You need to pick up vouchers from the CCP at ACS prior to TNRing. Pickup your vouchers on Tuesdays, Thursdays, or Fridays 11 AM - 4:30 PM, Wednesdays 11 AM - 6 PM, Saturdays 11 AM - 2:30 PM. Surgery days are Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays. remember it is against the law to harm community cats. Helpful websites:

Last couple of years we have hosted a Polar Express themed event for the holidays. Unfortunately, attendance was low and we may need to consider redirecting our efforts on this event.

no earlier than 6 PM. of the day preceding scheduled collection. All containers must be removed from the collection point by 10 PM on the same day as the collection except where such containers may be stored in alleys designated for collection. Containers not removed shall be declared a public nuisance and may be subject to an administrative citation with fines.

As you know, our Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions state under Article VII, Section 16, "..... garbage cans, service yards, woodpiles, or storage piles shall be kept screened by adequate planting or fencing so as to conceal them from view of neighboring dwellings and streets." Please be aware that our area is governed by our Covenants and you may be subject to an administrative citation with fines from Code Enforcement if you leave your waste receptacles out and not concealed.
