Leap of Faith

Wood ducks build their nests in hollow, rotted tree cavities, which are sometimes up to 60 feet above the ground. Within a day of hatching, the ducklings climb out of their nests.

Following their mother's beckoning call, the ducklings take a leap of faith from the safety and comfort of the nest and fall to the ground below before making their way to the water where their mother awaits.

As more holidays approach and families are getting together to celebrate, you can be sure to find some 'tried and true' dishes on the table. In 2006, we began collecting some of our favorite recipes that were later used in our cookbook "Food for the Soul" that quickly sold out. If you missed out on getting a copy, here are just a few favorite sweet treats handed down from past generations with connections to Acmar. Enjoy!

Wanda Powell's Date Nut Balls

1 ½ sticks butter 1 8 oz pkg seedless dates ¾ c sugar 2 c Rice Krispies 1 tsp vanilla extract 1c chopped pecans powdered sugar

Put butter, dates, and sugar in a sauce pan and slowly bring to boil. Boil for 10 minutes stirring often. Remove from stove and add vanilla. Mix thoroughly and set aside. Combine Rice Krispies and pecans in a mixing bowl. Mix in date mixture and set aside to cool. When cool enough to handle, roll into small balls and then roll them in powdered sugar.

Elma Turner's Pound Cake

2c all-purpose flour 2c sugar 1 stick butter 1/2c shortening 6 eggs 1 ½ tsp vanilla 1 ½ tsp butter flavor 1 ½ tsp lemon flavor pinch of salt

Combine all ingredients into a large mixing bowl. Beat 10 minutes on medium speed scraping bowl constantly. Divide batter into 2 greased or sprayed w/cooking oil loaf pans or 1 bundt pan. Bake at 325 ° for 50 minutes or until rises and crust cracks on top. Let set for 15 minutes and then invert cake onto a plate.

Tielle Deramus' Chocolate Pie

Ic sugar ¼ tsp salt 3½ T cornstarch 3½ T cocoa 2¼ c milk 3 eggs 1 tsp vanilla 2T butter Baked pie shell Scald milk Combine dry ingredients and mix well and add to milk. Separate eggs and beat yolks until light yellow. Add some of the hot mixture to temper eggs then stir the egg mixture into the hot milk mixture and cook until thick. Meringue Topping: Beat 3 egg whites with ¼ tsp cream of tartar and gradually add ¼ c sugar and beat until forms peaks. Bake at 350°until light brown.

Sis Bosworth's Quickie Peach Pie

1 stick butter 1 c sugar 1 c flour 1 ½ tsp vanilla flavoring 1 large can sliced peaches ½ c milk

Melt butter in a 2 qt casserole dish. In a mixing bowl, drain the juice from peaches and set peaches aside. Add into mixing bowl sugar, flour, vanilla, and milk then mix thoroughly. Pour over the butter in the dish Drop in peaches over the batter Bake in 400 ° oven for 30 -45 minutes until golden brown.

Jessie Turner's Banana Pudding

1 ½ c sugar ½ c flour 12 oz can evaporated milk 1 beaten egg ¼ stick butter 1 tsp vanilla flavoring 7 large bananas 6 oz vanilla wafers

In a large sauce pan, stir sugar, flour, milk egg and butter until mixed well. Cook over medium heat stirring often until it thickens. Add vanilla and mix well. In a 2 quart casserole dish alternately layer sliced bananas, vanilla wafers and pudding mixture with wafers on top.

Theatis Ash Jackson's Orange Balls

1 c crushed vanilla wafers $\frac{1}{2}$ c frozen orange juice Thawed & undiluted $\frac{3}{4}$ c powdered sugar $\frac{3}{4}$ c grated coconut $\frac{1}{2}$ c chopped pecans

Mix vanilla wafers, orange juice, powdered sugar, coconut and pecans. Roll into balls and refrigerate. Makes about 75 balls.

Vera Rowell's Congealed Cranberry Relish

3 (3oz) boxes raspberry Jell-O 1 ½ c sugar 2 oranges peels & diced 1 sm can crushed pineapple, drained 1 pkg fresh cranberries 1 c finely chopped celery 1 c finely chopped nuts.

Dissolve Jell-O in 3 c hot water. Add sugar and let soft set. Fold in pineapple, cranberries, oranges, celery and nuts. Refrigerate several hours before serving.

Betty Wilson's Popcorn Balls

1 c sugar 1/3 c light corn syrup 1/3 c water 1/4 c butter 3/4 tsp salt 3/4 tsp vanilla 3 qt popcorn

Mix sugar, syrup, butter, water & salt in a sauce pan. Cook, stirring only until sugar dissolves. Then continue cooking without stirring until syrup forms a brittle ball when dropped into cold water. Add vanilla and stir only until it's mixed. Place popcorn in a very large bowl and slowly pour mixture over it and mix well. Wet your hands slightly and shape mixture into balls. Use only enough pressure to make the ball stick together. Makes about 12 balls depending on how big you make them.
