BIG IDEA 1: THE REALITY OF EVIL – ITS VIGOR AND VITALITY



Job 1:6-7 Ephesians 1: 12 1 Peter 5:8

What do you think: Is the world getting better? Are we on the right track?

Washington Post asks the question: "The World Is Getting Better: Why Don't We Believe It?

[W]e would be remiss to discount how much progress has been made in the quarter-century since Bush's speech. According to the World Bank, the rate of extreme poverty fell from **37 percent** in 1990 to **about 10 percent last year**. The Food and Agriculture Organization **reports** that the rate of undernourishment fell from 18.6 percent to 10.9 percent during that same window. A **major study** by the University of Washington's Institute of Health Metrics and Evaluation found that life expectancy increased by 5.8 years for men and 6.6 years for women between 1990 and 2013. Doctors have made extraordinary strides in reducing the mortality rates of polio, measles and malaria. And the threat of a nuclear war, as well as that of a war between great powers, has declined significantly. (January 26, 2016)

- Liebnitz, the 18th Century philosopher, famously said, "We live in the best of all possible worlds." Do you agree? What would be the result of believing and acting on this approach?
- Remember "Disintegration?" Have you every heard of "entropy?" What does this observation from thermodynamics have to say about the "pre-set goodness of the world?" "entropy" is the observation that the energy in the universe does not increase, but decreases. Everything runs down.

Sin is the universal reality of the human condition.

BIG IDEA 2: GOD'S PEOPLE NOT EXEMPT – NOT EVEN THE HOLIEST



Abraham Jacob Moses Aaron The people themselves—Name some examples

Deuteronomy 24: 16 The fathers shall not be put to death for the children, neither shall the children be put to death for the fathers: every man shall be put to death for his own sin. See also Ezekiel 18:4.

BIG IDEA 3: EVIL OVERCOME, DISINTEGRATION REVERSED, <u>SYMPHONY RESTORED.</u>

What was the value of a sheep, goat or calf to the worshipper who was bringing it? Compare it to something today.

Of what quality did the animal have to be? Why?

Where did the worshipper have to put his hands when they brought the animal to the altar? Why?

Then what did the priest do? WHY?

What reaction do you have to this form of "worship"?

What do you think the worshipper learned?

BIG IDEA 4: EVIL IS OVERCOME THROUGH ATONEMENT



Is atonement necessary? WHY?

What is the relationship between atonement and forgiveness?

God's justice requires penalty for sin. The biblical penalty is death. In the day you eat of the fruit of the tree, you shall surely die. Gen 2.17. The wages of sin is death (Rom. 6.23)

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BIG IDEA 5: ATONEMENT IMAGES

Is atonement necessary for us to be forgiven?

Are we forgiven *because*:

- a. We are sorry?
- b. We confess we did wrong?
- c. We ask for forgiveness?
- d. We make restitution?
- e. We make an offering?
- f. Christ dies for our sins?

Which answer gives the only sufficient mean to take away our sins?

Some biblical images for atonement

- 1. Sacrificial Atonement OT sacrificial system imagery Man forfeited life; therefore, shedding of blood Heb 9:12, 22, 10.4-12
- Penal suffering; justification –(public law concept) legal imagery Isaiah 53 – sin forfeits life/ law requires penalty "The chastisement of our peace was upon him" Substitution before the bench of God's justice. Propitiation Rom 3.24-25; Heb 2: 17; 1 Jn 2.2 & 4: 10
- Redemption; Debt canceled; marketplace or commercial imagery What do we owe God? Obedience. bond written in ordinance against us – Parable in Mt 18.21ff—the Lord's Prayer in Matthew. the idea of redemption – buys back; Hosea 3. Col 2.13, 1 Peter 1.18
- 4. **Ransom** sin imprisons and hold hostage those who sin. **War imagery**: Captives... power Col 2.15, Matt 20. 28, Mk 10:45; Rev 5.4f
- Passover sacrifice—liberation imagery Like blood over doorpost saved Israel from death; So the blood of Jesus shed and seen spares those who depend on it from the wrath of God
- *The theological issue is this: What does atonement accomplish? For guilt or just the sense of guilt?* Objective or subjective Atonement? Is it for God or for us?

BIG IDEA 6: THE PURPOSE OF ATONEMENT: REMOVAL OF BARRIERS SO THAT GOD'S PROJECT CAN BE REALIZED.

SOME Scriptures relevant to the concept of ATONEMENT.

- Heb 8. 13-10:14 Compares Levitical offerings to Christ's once for all shedding of his blood.
- Heb 9: 22-without the shedding of blood there is no remission of sins
- Heb 9: 26 -- [appeared not to offer blood that was not his own]...he has appeared once for all at the end of the age to remove sin by the sacrifice of himself.
- 1 Cor 10: 16—The cup of blessing ... is it not participation in the blood of Christ?
- Eph 2:13—You who were once far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ
- 1 Pt 1.2, 18-19—sanctified by the Spirit to be obedient to Jesus Christ and to be sprinkled with his blood; you were ransomed from futile ways... not with perishable things like silver or gold, but with the precious blood of Christ, a lamb without defect or blemish.
- 1 Jn 1: 7 ... the blood of Jesus Christ cleanses us from all sin
- Romans 3.25 ... whom God put forward as an "atoning sacrifice" (propitiation) by his blood, effective through faith \rightarrow to prove that he is righteous
- 2 Cor 5: 17-21 God made him, who had no sin, to be sin for us that through him we might become the righteousness of God
- Heb 2: 17 therefore he had to become like his brothers in every way ... to make a sacrifice of atonement (propitiation) for the sins of the people.
- 1 Jn 2.2... and he is the "atoning sacrifice" [propitiation] for our sins and not for ours only, but also for the sins of the whole world.
- 1Jn 4.10 In this is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his son to be the "atoning sacrifice" [propitiation] for our sins.


