BY LAWS OF THE APOSTOLIC FAITH BIBLE COLLEGE, INC.

Article VII

Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers who believe in the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and who have accepted Him as their personal Savior. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows.

- * Triune God; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit
- * Creation and Formation
- Man is basically sinful and in need of salvation
- * Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Savior, which is the conception of Spiritual Life
- * Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul, and Body, A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ
- Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by the speaking in other languages
- * Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit
- * Sacrament of the Lord's Supper
- * Washing of feet
- * Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers
- * Do not condone divorce and remarriage
- * Destruction of the wicked
- * Conditional Immortality
- * Rapture of the Man Child Class
- * Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly
- * A ministry supported by tithes and offerings

These doctrines shall be adhered to in the teachings of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not inconsistent with the above listed basic doctrines.

As I reflect over the past seven years of our life and ministry so many thoughts have come to mind. Sis. Rhonda and I, in reality had no real understanding of what God was doing when He changed our ministry direction and summoned us to the Bible College. I will try to explain now what I did not know then. Here is a summary of our seven year journey and what we have found to be of most importance.

It was a bittersweet experience leaving our pastorate in Crosses, AR to come to Baxter Springs, KS. The bitter part was leaving where we were

comfortable, leaving our longtime friends, but the toughest part of all was leaving our family and the closeness of being involved with our children and grandchildren. The sweet part was knowing that God was directing our path and our ministry allowing us the experience of seeing more clearly the world in which we live.

We have said often that living through the teen age years of our own 3 children and our secular job work experiences helped prepare us for the task of ministering to the students which have walked into the Bible College campus. That is, somewhat, a true statement! But having been raised in a truly functional family in which most everyone knew Christ and love done another, we were largely oblivious to the pain endured by those who've never known that blessing.

The Lord has opened our eyes, through the lives of many of these young people, to the deep and incessant pain, and yes, often times mental and physical suffering they have endured in their lives. Understand, that some of the students have the same family history as we do and yet there are many who arrived at the Bible College completely alone, broken, hurting, no self esteem, some destitute, living without purpose and without hope of anything ever changing.

If for no other reason I believe the Lord sent us here to be a part of a spiritual awakening in the lives of these young people. What a blessing to see these young people evolve from living beaten down, to living a new life, high in Jesus Christ. We see them, after one and two years, with the joy of the Lord in their hearts, a new outlook on life, the hope of a bright future, and the blessing of having a spiritual family to love and be loved by.

We've also felt the hurt and frustration of the inevitable, when you prepare for hours and days and pour yourself unto giving Godly instruction only to see a young person that you have invested so much love, time and energy into simply walk away. We at first tried to consider our process or did we do something wrong. But then we realized that all we can do is what we are called to do, minister the Word and let the Word minister to the young people and pray that they make the right decisions.

So to sum up in a nutshell our journey at AFBC, we started here with one thing in mind and we are ending our time here and awaiting our next assignment from the Lord with one thing in mind. That is to "KEEP THE MAIN THING, THE MAIN THING" which is found in I Corinthians 2:2 "For I am determined not to know anything among you, save Jesus Christ, and Him crucified." They "Fought The Good Fight...Finished The Course...Kept The Faith"



On February 5, 2018, Pastor Stephen Abraham, father of India Gospel Outreach President Valson Abraham and long time President of India Bible College and Seminary, entered into the presence of his Lord and Savior. Family members who were with him at his passing said that just before he departed his earthly life, he showed clear signs of already seeing his new home in heaven with his Lord whom he served for more that 70 years. Thousands attended services to praise the way that God worked through his life and ministry, some coming from the U.S. and othe parts of the world. His wife, Mary Abraham preceded him on November 26.

2016. They were married 66 years and 7 months. We remember this couple who, over almost 70 years set the course for India Bible College, set a standard for future training institutes throughout India, made possible the birth and growth of India Gospel Outreach, raised a harvest force for India and beyond, and influenced many other likeminded ministries in countless ways. Over the decades they attracted everyone's attention for what they had accomplished, though they sought no attention. They excelled like few people excel, though to surpass others was never their aim.

Stephen Abraham was born Sept. 13, 1925, elder son of Pastor K.E. Abraham and Annamma Abraham, former school teachers who resigned their jobs to follow Christ, enter the ministry and live by faith. From his birth, his parents, pioneer missionaries to India's unreached peoples, set the vision and example that followed him for more than 92 years. When he was still young, his parents dedicated him to the Lord's service. He committed his life to Christ at age 11. He received his B.A. in Philosophy at the University of Kerala in 1949, attended the Apostolic Faith Bible College in Baxter Springs, KS in Jan.— March 1953 and 1954. He devoted the rest of his life serving the Lord in many ways. His teaching ministry at India Bible College began in 1956 and he served continually until 2013 when his health began to fail.

His wife, Mary Abraham was born Mary Chacko, on Sept. 2, 1925, eldest of six children of pioneer evangelistic/church planters. Pastor P.T. Chacko and Annamma Chacko, who also left all to follow Christ and live by faith. In 1936, she and her family left Kerala for Andrah Pradesh where her father planted churches throughout the state. Quickly learning the Teluga language, she translated for her father on the streets beginning at age 11. Mary Abraham was an outstanding student and teacher. In her secular work, she became known for excellence and efficiency. (Next page)

Mary (Chacko) Abraham and T. Stephen Abraham wed on April 27, 1950, beginning 66 years of loving marriage with four children; T. Valson Abraham, Annie Jacobs, Starla Luke and Shirley Chacko. They raised them all to love and serve the Lord. Their marriage combined partnership in ministry with a relationship of genuine love, trust and respect for one another that embodied Paul's ideal for Christian Marriage in Ephesians 5...

But they responded with grace and dignity, not responding in kind, not denigrating those who hated them. In the end, even their enemies had to admit the humility of this couple and confess their admiration. Basically quiet people, they communicated the Word of God with confidence, simplicity and authority to many kinds of people. Because they did not compromise the gospel to please the itching ears of men, God blessed their ministry with a growing church of godly men and women who are spreading the Good News throughout India and bevond.


