## A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ROBERT.....

Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Sometimes people just rub me the wrong way, either it is their personality clashing with mine, they did something I perceived as hurtful, or it's just that I took an immediate disliking to that person for some reason I am unable to explain. Whatever the reason I just can't seem to like them, whether it is justified or not is another question. Often I have found myself talking negatively about a person, or seeking new and creative reasons not to like that person. My words can sometimes cause others to distance themselves from an individual, and in that moment I feel justified because in my mind, they deserve it. As days, weeks, months, or years would pass I would learn more about these individuals. I would find out about early childhood traumas that they had endured, abuse that they lived with, medical issues that plagued them, the isolation that they experienced as a result of public cruelty, their screams for attention coupled with the social awkwardness that we all face, mental conditions that they lived with, abandonment issues, or maybe they were just different than I and those differences caused them to look at the world in a different way. I would come to the painful realization that my anger and dislike toward this person caused me to stop treating them like a fellow human being. I acted as if the one aspect that I did not like was what defined their entire life.

Was this fair? Absolutely not. There is never just one aspect of a person that can define that individual's entire life. We may self-identify under numerous labels used by society to categorize us but there is no one category that completely defines who we are. When we pass judgment based upon something we do not like about a person then we rob that individual of their humanity. Passing judgment is a way we try to trick ourselves into giving ourselves permission to dehumanize an individual and we need to ask ourselves; would we be okay with someone doing that to us? Of course not.

Does knowing these things mean I have stopped doing this? No, because unfortunately it is way too easy to demonize the other, yet that does not mean I stop trying. There are approximately 7.9 billion people alive right now on this planet, 333.6 million of those people live in the US, 5.9 million of them live in Wisconsin, and 556,189 of them live here in Dane County. With that many people it is inevitable that we will probably not mesh well with everyone. That most likely there are a few people out there that we should probably keep our distance from, but if that is not possible then it is our responsibility to do our best to try and treat them as fellow children of God. As a child I often heard the saying, "sticks and stones may break my bones but words will never hurt me." These are probably the most misleading words that have ever been spoken, because in fact words often have a far more lasting impact then most physical damage that we endure over our lives.

Ephesians 4:29 Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear.

I see a community based in love toward God and each other all around me yet we all need this reminder from time to time. Each of us struggle with the instinctual desire to slander others who we perceive as threats or are just different than ourselves, and it is important for us to know what we are doing so that we can try and stop ourselves before we hurt someone. With deep compassionate love comes also the need to protect that with which we love and I feel blessed to be part of a community united in mutual affection toward one another. Unfortunately we continue to live in a world that feeds on division and it is up to us to not allow that divisive rhetoric to get between us and our love for God and neighbor. Instead let us find ways in which to be peacemakers in our community, spreading the love of God which we have discovered through this community and our lord and savior Jesus Christ. 

# Chapter 10. CONGREGATION MEETINGS

**C10.01.** The annual meetings of this congregation shall be held at a time specified in the bylaws.

Regular Congregational meetings will be held twice per year as follows:

The Winter meeting shall be held no sooner than January or later than the first Sunday in February and its agenda shall include:

- Approval of the annual reports of Boards, Committees, organizations & individuals
- Approval of a budget for the calendar year
- Election of Audit Committee, Nominating Committee, Lutherdale Reps,
   Oakwood Reps, Synod Assembly Reps
- Other business which requires action by this congregation

The <u>Spring meeting</u> shall be held no sooner than May or later than the first Sunday in June and its agenda shall include:

- Election of Officers, Council members, and Board members
- Election of Endowment Foundation members
- Other business which requires action by this congregation
- Reports from Synod Assembly Reps, Lutherdale Reps, and Oakwood Reps

# Chapter 11 OFFICERS

**C11.02.** The officers shall be elected by this congregation by written ballet and shall serve for a <u>two\_(2)</u> year term, <u>beginning July 1 and ending June 30</u> at our spring annual meeting

## Chapter 12.

#### CONGREGATION COUNCIL

**C12.02.** The members of the Congregation Council except the pastor(s) shall be elected at a legally called meeting of this congregation at the spring meeting. They shall serve a two (2) year term with each term beginning July 1 and ending on June 30. Newly elected Congregation Council members shall be installed at a Sunday worship service prior to the date they assume office.

#### Chapter 13

#### C13.06. & C13.07. Congregational Boards

The board members shall be elected at the regular <u>Spring meeting</u> of this congregation. Half of the members of each board shall be elected in even-numbered years and the remainder of the board shall be elected in odd-numbered years. Board member's terms will be two years. There is no limit to the number of terms a board member may serve.
