- When first registering a service dog, the dog no longer needs to have a special tag
- Humane agents, animal control and shelters may issue written authorization to euthanize severely sick or injured livestock if municipal clerk or animal control is notified who attempted to contact the owner AND veterinarian issues written statement that recovery is doubtful PLUS a veterinarian may also authorize immediate euthanasia if the above is followed – all are exempt from civil liability
- For animal cruelty: drugs now specifically include narcotics and similar drugs AND civil penalty for cruelty is now up to \$5000 for 1st violation and \$10,000 per additional
- Stray livestock where owner is unknown may be taken to facility capable of handling it or wherever the municipality designates, and municipalities must hold them for 10 days before either adopting or euthanizing them and may reimburse facility for expenses
