Greetings Everyone!

rinity Church just finished a dedicated 40 days of intimate prayer with God. Small groups formed to check in weekly and discuss what they have been experiencing and learning as they spent 40 days in prayer.

Now, it is not as if anyone was not praying before these 40 days! I believe

what was happening was that people were committing themselves to praying differently. Maybe they prayed more frequently than before, tried praying in another style, or at different times. I saw how many people tried to pray more boldly, asking God for bigger dreams and risks and desiring to see things about God they did not see before.

And you know what? Things started happening! I heard that people shared

startling stories in these prayer groups. People saw prayers they never thought God would answer suddenly answered. People discovered something new about God and began to see things a little more like how God sees things. People learned things about themselves, things they need to work on, or affirmations about how God views them!

> At the end of the 40 days, we gathered to celebrate what God was doing and to share stories about what being intentional in prayer was doing among our church. I was amazed to hear such beautiful stories of victory, healing, connection, and growth. Many people probably

thought they had learned a little and grown a bit. Instead, they found out they grew a lot!

Even though the 40 days of prayer are over, that does not mean our days of

praying are over! I pray this is the beginning of new things when people take what they discovered and build upon it. If you grew in a new prayer discipline, keep growing! If you found a fresh voice in conversation with God, keep expanding your prayer vocabulary! If you prayed boldly and found an answer in your boldness, pray even bolder!

Praying without ceasing sounds lovely until you think about how hard that is. We cease praying all the time! Our "amens" become "goodbyes" in our conversations with God, only to be picked up down the road when we say "hello" to God once again. To pray without ceasing is to discover all the ways, great and small, we can be in conversation with God. We learn to find little seconds and moments where we can share a thought with God.

For many of us, saying a prayer is like going for a walk. Prayer is an intentional action that takes a while to complete. Yet, we take steps throughout the day! May you recognize that prayers to God can be like the steps you take throughout the day, whether a long walk or the steps you take from one room to another.
