Old Growth Forest dedication at Sweet Root Natural Area (follow Black Valley Road State Route 2015, south of Everett, about 15 miles to the picnic area at Sweet Root Park on the Right). The dedication is at 11 am, followed by a short walk and then we'll drive to WOSA's Sulzbacher Demonstration Forest for a 1 pm dedication of the Old Growth Forest Stand. A short hike will also follow that dedication.

Wonders of Wildlife: Go exploring with a flashlight!

Jefferson salamanders, wood frogs, and spotted salamanders, migrate to woodland pools at night during spring rains when snow might still be covering the ground. They mate and lay eggs, then return to the woods. Jefferson and Spotted salamanders spend the rest of the year under ground, but you might find wood frogs in the leaf litter of your woods during warm weather. (Photos by the Jacksons.)
