RESTORED

Scripturally, the land God promised Abraham in Genesis 15:18 covered from the eastern boarder of Egypt (Wadi) to the Great River (the Euphrates) in the north. This was the land Abraham, Isaac and Jacob and their families inhabited prior to the migration to Egypt in Genesis chapter 46. They were enslaved in Egypt for 430 years. Finally, when the time came God delivered them and restored them back to the land where their ancestors had lived before migrating to Egypt. Of

course, Moses was at the center of this deliverance.

This story reminds us of last Sunday's gospel – the story of the prodigal son and how he was restored to his father's grace and favor. This Sunday, the Church presents us with another story of restoration – the woman caught in the act of adultery. According to the Law of Moses, she was supposed to be stoned to death. Only God knows how many women died through such an unjust law. Of course, the men walked away free, but we'll not go there today. Anyhow, Jesus – who aptly said that He came, not for the healthy, but for those who are sick – saved her from physical death and more importantly from spiritual death. Ultimately, He shamed those ready to cast the first stone. Or rather, they shamed themselves as they realized their own sins and walked away. I wonder if any of them went back to Jesus or even to the woman to acknowledge their mistake of thinking they were better than her.

How often do we ourselves stop to remember that we too have at one point or another received great mercy from God and from others? For it is only in such remembering that we become truly human and forgiving. If not, we risk becoming hardened like the elder brother of the prodigal son.

This past Thursday we celebrated St Isidore, bishop and doctor of the Church and patron saint of the Internet! Never mind that he

has been in heaven for over 1,300 years. He succeeded his brother (who is also a saint) as bishop of Seville. Among other things, he combatted heretics in Spain and ultimately compiled an encyclopedia of universal knowledge – 20 volumes to be precise. It was pretty much like the bible in importance. He once said that, "If a man wants to be always in God's



company, he must pray regularly and read regularly".

I bring that up because, it's also by praying and reading regularly that we come to know ourselves, gnats, warts and all. Of course we're talking about both spiritual books and also some of the wonderful books out there today, including self-help ones, psychological ones, etc. Knowledge, they said, is power – power to change. So, may the Lord keep us humble, knowledgeable, and open to His mercy. Amen.


