Thus it is appropriate to rejoice as we see the goal of the season approaching: "The Lord is near." We hear in the reading from Isaiah that the desert will rejoice and sing and bloom with abundant flowers. This is of course a metaphor for the desert of our hearts, we are called to rejoice because Christ is near.
