

Where are fundamental rights found?

The vast majority of fundamental rights are **not** found in the text of the Constitution. The Supreme Court has interpreted the Constitution to have such rights 'emanating' in the 'dark shadows' of the Bill of Rights (see *Griswold v. Connecticut*). This is how the right to privacy, education, and family relations were found. *Originalists*, such as Supreme Court Justices Scalia and Rehnquist, are fully against the Substantive Due Process Clause- and rights found therein- because they do not believe in interpreting the Constitution to fit modern jurisprudence.

Other countries do not have the protection of fundamental rights as we do. This is what separates us from other countries and makes us the hallmark of freedom in the world. We have Due Process- both Substantive and Procedural- that is the cornerstone of our democracy.
