## October 31, 1517 500 Hundred years Ago The Reformation begins!

On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther nailed 95 Theses to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. Before that, he was studying to become a lawyer. It was during that time he had a frightful experience in a storm. He vowed that if he were to live through the storm, he would become a monk. Because of the vow, he stopped studying law and entered a monastery. In 1505, he joined the Augustinian Order to study, pray, and worship. In 1507, he became a priest.

However, even as a priest Luther was concerned about God's love. For him, God and hell were frightening realities. Believing he should love God, BUT being unable to do so, hell seemed to be his destinv.

## AND THEN GOD...

met Luther in the Word. The above verses from Romans answered the question that Luther had been asking for years, "How can I be sure that God forgives my sin and loves me?" He fully believed that Jesus took the punishment for his sins. He died on the cross. Luther now had the assurance of his salvation.

Luther had discovered a living principle in Scripture, "justification by faith." From that event, the Reformation began! But how can that discovery change the belief and culture of the Church? He started with 95 statements nailed to the church door. The first statement reads, "When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said, 'Repent' (Mt 4:17), He willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance." Any change begins with repentance. Any relationship with God begins with repentance.

When Jesus began to preach, He started with the word, 'repent.' Why? Because it leads to change. Luther started with 'repent' because the Church needed to be changed. It wasn't easy. It lead to misunderstanding and great conflict. But it needed to be done. The reformation started with the authority of Scripture. It allowed Luther to stand firm on the Word of God. He was demanded to recant his teaching. Instead he said, "Unless I am convinced, I am bound by the texts of the Bible, my conscience is captive to the Word of God, I neither can nor will recant anything, since it is neither right nor safe to act against conscience. Here I stand. I can do no other. God help me. Amen."

But He kept Noah and his family inside a huge boat, an ark, that He had told Noah how to build. The Bible tells us, "*Noah did everything just as God commanded him"* (Genesis 6:22).
