

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. **And also with you.**





SECOND READING: 1 Peter 1:3-9

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! By his great mercy he has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, ⁴and into an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you, ⁵who are being protected by the power of God through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time. ⁶In this you rejoice, even if now for a little while you have had to suffer various trials, ⁷so that the genuineness of your faith — being more precious than gold that, though perishable, is tested by fire — may be found to result in praise and glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed. ⁸Although you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy, ⁹for you are receiving the outcome of your faith, the salvation of your souls.

Elsbeth Dudey June 27, 1927 — September 28, 2017

Elsbeth Dudey was born in 1927 in Empede, Germany, a farming town northwest of Hannover, and passed away peacefully in Everett, Washington. She was preceded in death by her parents Wilhelm and Else Vehrenkamp (née Asche), older sister Waltraud (Peter) Hanke and younger brother Hansjürgen (Helga) Vehrenkamp. Elsbeth was also preceded in death by her loving husband Karl, who passed away in 2013.

Elsbeth and her family lived through World War II in Hannover, Germany. Elsbeth immigrated to Stockholm, Sweden to find work and escape the poverty in post war Germany in 1952.

She immigrated to Milwaukee, Wisconsin in 1956, where she met and married Karl Dudey in 1958. Karl and Elsbeth had two children Marc and Evelyn (Evy). Karl and Elsbeth moved to Bradenton, Florida in 1984 and to Bothell, Washington in 2000.

Elsbeth is survived by her son Marc and his wife Yan, and their sons Michael and Thomas of Houston, Texas, and by her daughter Evelyn and her husband Mark Glidden of Everett, Washington. She is also survived by her cousin Otto Heinrich (Karin) Vehrenkamp, niece Ursula Hanke, nephews Peter Michael (Barbara) Hanke, Uwe Vehrenkamp and Eike Vehrenkamp; all live in Germany.
