APPRENTICESHIPS ATSSA Scholarships & Mack Awards Encourage & support apprentices & their programs!

As a recap, Volvo Trucks Canada introduced their "Fleet Maintenance Manager of the Year" award at the CFMS in 1989; Mack Trucks Canada simultaneously instituted a 'Mack Plaque' award for the top three apprentices in the MAP ATSSA sponsored class at Centennial College.

At the Mack sponsored meeting in November of 2012, the ATSSA implemented a scholarship fund to go along with these Plaque awards. The top award is \$2,500, the second \$1,500, and the third \$1,000. Although not compulsory, the purpose of the award funds is to help with these students with their apprenticeship costs. To date, these incentives, together with ongoing mentoring by the ATSSA members & Centennial faculty, has stimulated competition amongst the applicant pool vying to gain a seat in the ATSSA class. Subsequently, the completion for seats in the program is providing a higher calibre of student to the industry.
