



Eucharistic Revival in the Catholic Church: Weekly Bulletin Articles

The Catholic Church in the United States has been on a 3-year process of Eucharistic Revival, and we are now in the 2nd year and focusing on revival at the parish level (see this website for more, https://www.eucharisticrevival.org). In addition to trying our best to celebrate every single Mass reverently, attentively, and prayerfully, one effort we will be making is **to write a small bulletin article every week for a year** in order to help all people understand the Catholic Mass more fully. Not only can this help us understand how each prayer and symbol and movement has deep meaning and symbolism, but all the prayers, symbols, and movements should also lead us into the reality of Christ's love on the Cross and His grace poured out from the Resurrection and how we can encounter Him present to us today throughout the entirety of the Mass! Please consider reading along each week with these bulletin articles to help you better understand the history, meaning, beauty, and reality of what we celebrate every weekend as Catholics. This can help us to have a Eucharistic Revival at our parish, and to know, love, and serve Christ more fully every time we attend the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass here at OLV.

Bulletin Article #2 = "The Lord be with you" R: "And with your spirit"

Right after the sign of the Cross at the beginning of Mass, we hear this prayer from the Priest. From the Old Testament, angels have said this phrase, "The Lord be with you" to encourage leaders who are sent on important missions by God such as Moses, Joshua, and Gideon (see Exodus 3, Joshua 1, or Judges 6). This phrase is often encouraging these people when they feel too weak or not worthy for a particular mission that God is giving them. God's response is that He will be with them to support them in their weakness and to use them powerfully despite their shortcomings. St. Paul continues this teaching and reality in many of his New Testament letters to the early Christian Churches (see Rom. 1:7, 1 Cor 1:3, or Gal 1:3). The response, "And with your spirit" encompasses a prayer for the priest as well as acknowledging Jesus' special presence in the priest during the entire Mass! We can ask God to encourage us as we begin each Mass to recognize His presence with us, both in the Priest, the prayers, the Eucharist, but also in His mission He is giving each of us to live the faith out to the fullest in our unique situation in our lives.

The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings w/your children

When Jesus wanted to teach people something important he used parables. Parables are stories with more than one meaning. One meaning is something from everyday life that people would understand. The other meaning is a deeper one that we have to look for the meaning.

In today's Gospel Jesus tells about workers in a vineyard. A vineyard is a very large area with lots of grapevines. During Jesus' time there were people who worked every day at the same job and those that worked for a single day doing different jobs each day.

In the parable, the first workers came about 5 AM and worked the entire day. The owner went out again and again through the day to get more workers. The last workers started about 5 PM. When it came time to pay the workers, the owner paid the last workers the same amount that was promised to the first workers.



If you were a worker that started at 5 AM, how would you feel? Would you expect more money than those that started at 5 PM?


In the parable, the morning people were angry and thought it wasn't fair.

The owner thinks like God thinks. Everyone received what they were promised. Everyone got enough. You might say that the owner was very generous.

What does the parable tell us about how God thinks? God gives what he promises, what we need. God is generous.



BOOK OF THE MONTH - September & October

The next book of the month is going to be Gratitude and Grit: The Life of Blessed Solanus Casey, which is a beautiful and inspirational little summary of one of the great Saints in the history of the United States of America. Growing up in a big Irish Immigrant family who were farmers in Wisconsin along the Mississippi River, Bernard Casey showed his toughness but also his compassion, faithfulness, and love through a life as a Franciscan simplex priest that brought so many people dramatically to Christ. He started as a simple porter or door man, but he ended up being a type of celebrity and known miracle worker, even though his entire approach was simply dedicated prayer, time, listening, and humility for those he encountered day after day. Learn about the source of thousands of miracle reports and the man who cooperated with God's plan in this rather short but beautiful book about his life. As in recent months, you will need to purchase this book yourself if you would like to read it (please contact Fr. Ben if you don't have the means to purchase it online), but even if you don't get a chance to read through his story, Fr. Ben will give a presentation on Blessed Solanus Casey and this book on **Wednesday, November 8**th in our Church Social Hall from 7:30-8:30 pm! Please consider attending this meeting (there is no commitment or book club; this is always just an open invitation to everyone every two months) and let's pray for each other moving forward.
