

A. Dale Lacky Student-Athlete Winners Announced; Smith, Wolfley win Clarke Coover Memorial Award

LODI (April 21, 2022) – The CIF Sac-Joaquin Section is proud to announce its A. Dale Lacky Scholar-Athlete Award winners for outstanding athletic performance, community service and academic success during their four years of high school. The award, named after former Section and State CIF President, A. Dale Lacky, recognizes the top male and female student-athletes within the Section. Each league is able to send two winners, one male and one female, to be honored. The scholarship committee has selected four male and four female students as the recipients of a \$1,000 scholarship. The remaining nominees are awarded a \$500 scholarship from the Section. In addition, the Clarke Coover Award has been given to two of the top honorees. This award is named in honor of former Section Commissioner Clarke Coover. The 2022 winners of the Clarke Coover Award are Ceres' Verlis Smith and Gregori's Fallon Wolfley.
