## **MOSQUITO SPRAYING**

The city will be spraying for mosquitos every Tuesday as needed beginning around 9:00 P.M. If it is windy or raining the alternate day will be Wednesday.

## **FLUSHING HYDRANTS**

During the months of May, June, and July the city will be flushing fire hydrants. Please check your water before doing laundry.

## **STREET PROJECT**

The city has entered into an Engineering Services Agreement with Snyder & Associates for a street and infrastructure replacement project. At this time, they are in the infrastructure evaluation phase with a master plan to be drafted in August. Engineering fees for this project are being paid for from the Local Option Sales Tax that the City will begin seeing in August.

## **STREET REPAIRS**

You will be seeing Mack's Asphalt and LL Pelling in town sealcoating and repairing streets. In addition to the normal water main break and sewer line street repairs, there will be needed repairs on Kenwood Street and sealcoating on Main Street from Pine Street to Pioneer Road, Park Street from Chestnut Street to the park entrance, and Blackhawk Street from the cemetery to Water Plant Road. Blackhawk Street, from the cemetery to the county road, will be milled and relayed. Work should begin sometime in July or August. These projects are being funded by the additional Road Use Tax. The City asks for your patience and cooperation during these projects.
