When we come to Church, there are many ways in which we encounter Christ. These encounters will bear fruit in our daily lives, renewing us...transforming us...if we have the right disposition. One of the ways in which we encounter Christ is in the Sacrament of Confession. Today's Gospel about the tax collector is a good example of how we ought to come to the Sacrament. The tax collector was a bad hombre, a nasty guy who worked for the occupying Roman Empire and would cheat the people of their money to line his own pocket.

In this case, the tax collector acknowledges that he is an ungodly sinner who lives a life of vice and begs pardon for his sinful way of life, desiring mercy. There is no pretense, there is no showmanship. He recognizes his unworthiness and is sincere about his sorrow. Beating his chest, on his knees, he places his trust in divine mercy: "God have mercy on me, a sinner."

With the tax collector's humility and authentic contrition for his sins, a real encounter takes place which leads to him walking away justified (made right with God) and transformed. Filled with humility and sorrow, he was aware of God's loving presence, was able to let down the guard, and made himself vulnerable. In humility, he recognized the he was created, willed and loved into being by the Creator God and despite his sinfulness, God never diverted his loving gaze from him, calling him to sorrow and granting him forgiveness.

Since my arrival at St. Mary Star of the Sea, I have attempted to increase the public availability of the Sacrament of Confession. I would hope that after meditating upon this Gospel and the example of the tax collector, you might consider availing of the Sacrament once again. We need to get down on our knees and pray...Have mercy on me a sinner! Fostering this spirit of humility and sorrow allows us to come to the altar of God, encountering Him so intimately in the Eucharist knowing exactly who we are so that we can be transformed by the very food that we are given to eat.
