

Specialist Toccara R. Green, USA (Rosedale, MD, 23 years)

57th Transportation Company, 548th Corps Support Battalion, Fort Drum, NY

Died: 14 Aug 05 in Al Asad, Iraq

SPC Green died when multiple improvised explosive devices detonated near her unit during convoy operations.

Airman First Class Elizabeth N. Jacobson, USAF (Riviera Beach, FL, 21 years)

17th Security Forces Squadron, Goodfellow Air Force Base, TX

Died: 28 Sep 05 near Camp Bucca, Iraq

A1C Jacobson died when an improvised explosive device detonated near her convoy vehicle.

First Lieutenant Debra A. Banaszak, MO ARNG (Bloomington, IL, 35 years)

1035th Maintenance Company, Jefferson Barracks, MO

Died: 28 Oct 05 at Camp Victory, Kuwait

1LT Banaszak died of noncombat related injuries.

Sergeant Julia V. Atkins, USA (Bossier City, LA, 22 years)

64th Military Police Company, 720th Military Police Battalion, 89th Military Police Brigade, Ft. Hood, TX

Died: 10 Dec 05 in Baghdad, Iraq

SGT Atkins died when an improvised explosive device detonated near her HMMWV during patrol operations in Baghdad.

Sergeant Regina C. Reali, USAR (Fresno, CA, 25 years)

351st Civil Affairs Command, Mountain View, CA

Died: 23 Dec 05 in Baghdad, Iraq

SGT Reali, a civil affairs specialist, died one week after her 25th birthday when an improvised explosive device detonated near her HMMWV. She is survived by her father and a brother who served in the Navy.

Sergeant Myla L. Maravillosa, USAR (Wahiawa, HI, 24 years)

C Company, 301st Military Intelligence Battalion, Honolulu, HI

Died: 24 Dec 05 in Kirkuk, Iraq

SGT Maravillosa died of injuries sustained earlier that day in Al Hawijah, Iraq, when her HMMWV was attacked by enemy forces using rocket-propelled grenades. She was an only child.

First Lieutenant Jaime L. Campbell, AK ARNG (Ephrata, WA, 25 years)

1st Battalion, 207th Aviation Regiment, Anchorage, AK

Died: 7 Jan 06 near Tal Afar, Iraq

1LT Campbell died when the UH-60 Black Hawk helicopter she was piloting crashed in Northern Iraq. In 1998, Campbell graduated from high school as student body president and was the state rodeo queen. Her husband, Army Captain Sam Campbell was Iraq at the time she was killed and accompanied her home. Campbell's father, an Army Command Sergeant Major, had just returned from a tour in Iraq and had spent five days with Campbell while on a break just two months prior to her death.
