Lakewood Forest Spring EGG-stravaganza Saturday, April 16



This park is located between Lakewood Forest Drive and Jones Road, on the south side of Grant Road. Check in at the park pavilion when you arrive.

Get ACC Approval Before Building!

Lakewood Forest is a Deed Restricted community. The Fund's Architectural Control Committee (ACC) must approve all exterior remodeling and building projects before the project begins. The Fund has the necessary legal authority to enforce this rule.



The Lakewood Forest Fund has a contract with Harris County Precinct 4's Contract Deputy Program. We have one Lieutenant, one Corporal and three Deputies working approximately 70 percent of their time for Lakewood Forest, and 30 percent for Harris County.





HOUSTON ROSE SOCIETY



The American Garden Rose Selections (AGRS) is a national testing program for new rose varieties. The program evaluates new roses for a period of two years at trial site locations around the country to determine the adaptability of those varieties to the specific regions where they were tested. Rose growing experts review and rate the roses several times a year to discover their strengths and weaknesses.

THE ROSES WITH THE HIGHEST RATINGS ARE GIVEN THE PRESTIGIOUS AMERICAN GARDEN ROSE SELECTIONS REGIONAL CHOICE AWARD.

The AGRS symbol lets you know this rose has withstood years of scrutiny and evaluation to deem it appropriate for your garden.

Pat Shanley, founding and current Chairwoman of AGRS will share information about the beautiful roses that won AGRS awards in 2021/2022 and are well suited to our area. Pat is perhaps best known for her service as Past President of the American Rose Society. She is also the founding Chair of the New York Metropolitan Rose Council, founding and current President of the Manhattan Rose Society and founding Chair of the Great Rosarians of the World East lecture series. She is also an ARS Horticulture and Arrangement Judge, Master Rosarian, recipient of a number of awards for her service in the ARS and local rose societies as well as an excellent author.

The luck of the Irish carried forward as speaker Tanya Whitaker brought a program on her extensive experience as the owner of Farm to Market Water Lilies. She and co-worker Dana covered many varieties of day blooming water lilies and night blooming water lilies. Gorgeous images of fan favorites can be seen at www.farmtomarketwaterlilies.com. Tanya demonstrated how to plant the lotus, a large leaf lily. Most water lily varieties reportedly do well in a sand and clay soil potted and submerged in water about one and a half foot or more deep.

Corresponding Secretary Dawn Bramwell read a thank you note from Reach Unlimited, acknowledging a recent donation to their bird feeding project. Another Reach project was reported by Margo Probst on the use of planters such as the blue frog donated by our President to make dish gardens for succulents in their greenhouse. It is open to the public with herbs, succulents and vegetables for sale.

Horticulture Chair Bette Gerhold included a couple of pearls in her report to help us as gardens transition from winter to spring:

- Test for deadwood by bending the branch. If it is flexible, leave it in place at least until the last freeze. Snap off stiff, dry twigs with your fingers or clippers.
- Make the task more manageable and less overwhelming by tackling it section by section.

12900 block of Elmington Drive – Deputies responded to location in reference to a disturbance other. An investigation was completed. Case closed.




