

Welcome

National Garden Clubs, Inc. welcomes all students, both members and non-members, to its Landscape Design Schools. The Landscape Design Schools include a series of four courses, refreshers and the establishment of Landscape Design Councils. **Members** completing the series, passing the examinations with grades of 70 or above, are eligible to receive the Consultants Certification Card, a NGC credential. This certification does not qualify the graduate to go into professional practice, but it is considered a significant achievement among NGC members.

A Certificate of Attendance may be awarded to a **non-member student** attending a course. A Certificate of Achievement may be awarded to a non-member student upon completion of the four courses with a passing grade of 70 on each of the exams.

Non-member students who have successfully completed the four courses, with a grade of at least 70 on each exam, may apply for Consultant certification by joining a NGC club within one year after completion.

Out-of-State students are welcome to attend. Out-of-State students' records will be sent to their home State's Landscape Design Schools Chairman.

Objectives of the Landscape Design Schools

1. Develop a greater sense of appreciation, pride and knowledge about our private, public and historical gardens.
2. Become better informed in order to promote positive changes in our surroundings to encourage beauty, utility, convenience, sound ecological practice and ease of maintenance.
3. Encourage a better understanding of the landscape design process to promote landscapes that will sustain sound management.
4. Stimulate interest in all phases of landscape design, including community planning.
5. Develop a contingent of qualified Landscape Design Consultants to serve in such decision-making areas of public life as providing leadership, educational programs, scholarships, awards and promoting better landscape design.

General Information

The **Consultant Certification Card** is issued to NGC members after they have completed Landscape Design School Courses I – IV with a passing grade of 70 or more on every exam. These four courses must be completed within seven years.

After passing two courses, a student may become a **Provisional Consultant** and join a Landscape Design Council.

To remain in Good Standing, every five years Landscape **Design Consultants** must continue their education by attending a LD Refresher or a LD School Course – no exam required. After a Consultant's fourth refresher, the Consultant becomes a Master Consultant. Consultants or Master Consultants may earn refresher credit only once within a calendar year.
