### A. MAYOR:

Mayor Keckler announced Community Events:

Mayor Keckler announced that the snow queen nominations have closed and were sent to the Review Times for voting, with three (3) candidates being Teresa Lee, Bev Lang and Tootsie Gillig.

December 7<sup>th</sup>, 2019 from 9AM to 1PM, Kids Maker Market, sponsored by Chamber of Commerce, a map of the many projects and their locations can be picked up.

December 7<sup>th</sup>, 2019 is from 10AM to 12:30PM is breakfast with Santa.

December 7<sup>th</sup>, 2019 at 1:30 PM is the Christmas Rotary Parade, which immediately after the parade is the tree lighting ceremony on the City lawn with the help of the snow queen, communications with the Fostoria High School band director about the band performing on the City lawn for the tree lighting ceremony.

## B. SAFETY-SERVICE DIRECTOR:

Deb Hellman discussed with Council the two (2) new business pieces of legislation and mentioned to Council that the Traffic Control Map changes and stated that everything in the piece of legislation relates to schools. The next piece of legislation is the Chemical bids, she wanted this passed as an emergency, however that was not going to happen due to absent Councilmembers, she has requested that this gets passed as an emergency at the December 2019 Council meeting.

Deb Hellman also mentioned about the Electric Aggregation and the vote allowed the City to do some researching of companies at this time, they have not chosen a company, as this is still being researched. Councilperson Cassidy questioned the process of these companies, as he has had soliciting phone calls, as well as people showing up on his property. Deb Hellman answered yes, due to these companies now knowing the City has the option to choose a company and none has been selected yet.
