A Message from our Pastor Allegra Hoots MDiv

Dear Friends,

Greetings to you in the holy and mighty name of the Lord Jesus Christ, our blessed redeemer. As always, I trust God that this message finds you in good health, rejoicing in the joy of the Lord, and experiencing the peace of Christ that surpasses human understanding.

The writer of James, in chapter 2, quoted above, says that our connection to God is shown in good deeds that help people with their basic needs - food, clothing, shelter, and safety, driven by compassion without wanting or expecting anything in return. The writer's example of not neglecting a person's need for a coat gives a universal, clear example of a compassionate act as a way of showing God's love. 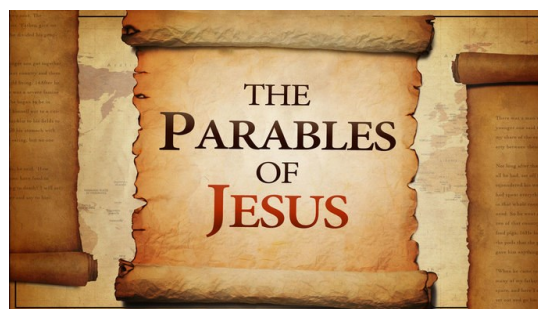

The no-fee workshops will last six weeks, starting in September or October.*

### 3. Technology-Based Workshops at AristaCare:

*On behalf of UPC, Davaughn is collaborating with AristaCare staff to conduct a series of no-fee technology-based hands-on workshops that will benefit the facility's residents, regardless of age. The workshops are scheduled to begin in July.*

⇒ Rally Day - September 15<sup>th</sup>: First day of classes for all ages for the new year.

This is the celebration of the start to the new church year (liturgical) with a renewed effort in involving children, youth, and adults in Sunday morning classes for Christian education.

⇒ Confirmation Class: (September to December) These classes will be incorporated into the regularly scheduled classes

Confirmation class is preparation during which the candidates participate in church activities and reflect on questions of faith and life. This is an opportunity to pause on the verge of adulthood and examine our beliefs and explore how faith might be a good life-long partner.

If you were baptized as children or infants, it is our parents who initially accept the vows on our behalf. Confirmation then becomes our opportunity to personally reaffirm those baptismal vows and claim the grace offered by Christ in baptism. Confirmation is a reaffirmation of our baptismal vows.

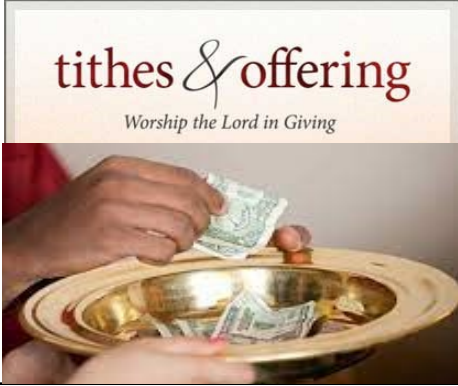

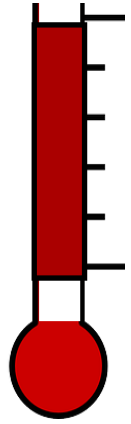
## United Presbyterian Church BUILDING FUND

As of 6/1/2024 the total collected is \$13,543



The UPC administration committee wants to be certain all UPC members and friends are aware of the establishment of the Building Fund at UPC to which contributions can be made to help defray the cost of the maintenance of the facility which ensures the health and safety of the occupants of our facility.

This building fund originated in 2021. Our facility was built in 1952 and, despite our faithful maintenance efforts, the facility is showing the signs of 71 years of wear and tear. The performance of our investment accounts, collection of rental fees and the faithful and generous giving our members and friends have provided the funds for our maintenance.



Our maintenance costs, however, are mounting to a point where we need to continue our appeal to the generosity of our church community and friends. ## CHILDREN'S CORNER

### Jesus and the Sabbath

**Theme:** Jesus is Lord of the Sabbath.

**Object:** A list of silly laws.

**Scripture:** Then Jesus asked them, "Which is lawful on the Sabbath: to do good or to do evil, to save life or to kill?" But they remained silent. Mark 3:4 (NIV)



Sometimes the people who make our laws get a little carried away and pass some very silly laws. I did some research on the Internet and found some examples of some of the silliest laws I have ever heard of.

In Fairbanks, Alaska, it is illegal to serve alcohol to a moose. I wonder if it is legal to serve alcohol to a bear?

There is a city in Arizona where it is illegal to drive a car in reverse. So, how are you supposed to get out of your parking space at the mall?

There is a town in Minnesota where a woman can be arrested for impersonating Santa Claus. Hmm...I wonder if they can impersonate Mrs. Claus?

In Oklahoma, people who make ugly faces at dogs can be arrested and put in jail or fined. I wonder if a bulldog can get thrown in the pound for making ugly faces at people?

In Nicholas County, West Virginia, a preacher is not allowed to tell jokes from the pulpit. Uh-oh, I hope they don't think this sermon is a joke!

In Morrisville, Pennsylvania, women need a permit to wear makeup. Oh my! I hope the makeup police aren't here this morning.

I think you will all agree that those are some pretty silly laws, but this is nothing new. Even back in the day when Jesus lived, they had some pretty silly laws. There was a group of religious leaders called the Pharisees who were keepers of the law of Moses and they believed that keeping the law was everything. They also believed that their own understanding and teaching about the law was the only correct teaching. Jesus was quite often opposed by the Pharisees and was accused of breaking the laws of Moses, especially the laws regarding the Sabbath. Today's lesson tells us about two times that the Pharisees accused Jesus and his followers of violating the Sabbath.

One Sabbath day, Jesus and his disciples were walking through some fields of grain. His disciples were hungry and began to break off some heads of grain to eat. The Pharisees saw it and said to Jesus, "Look, why are they breaking the law by harvesting grain on the Sabbath?"

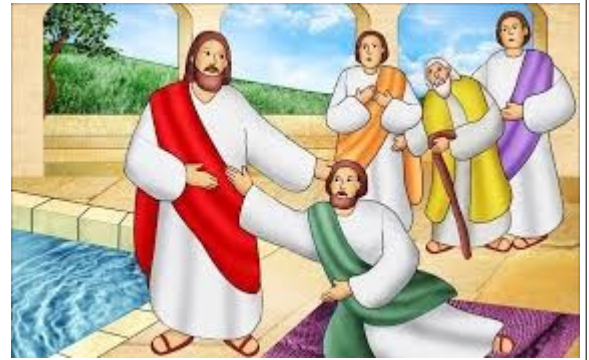
Realizing the foolishness of the Pharisees to compare breaking off a few heads of grain to eat with harvesting the whole crop, Jesus answered them, "Haven't you read in the Scriptures what David did when he and his companions were hungry? He went into the house of God and broke the law by eating the sacred loaves of bread that only the priests were allowed to eat. He also shared it with his companions."

Then he said to them, "The Sabbath was made to meet the needs of people, and not people to meet the requirements of the Sabbath."

Another time, Jesus went into the synagogue and noticed that there was a man who had a deformed hand. Since it was the Sabbath, some of them were looking for a reason to accuse Jesus, so they watched to see if he would heal the man on the Sabbath. If so, they would accuse Jesus of working on the Sabbath.

Jesus said to the man with the deformed hand, "Come and stand in front of everyone." Then he turned toward his enemies and asked, "Does the law permit good deeds on the Sabbath, or is it a day for doing evil?" The Pharisees refused to answer him.

Jesus looked at them angrily and was saddened at the hardness of their hearts. Then he said to the man, "Hold out your hand." He held out his hand and Jesus healed him. Immediately left to go and meet with Herod to plot how to kill Jesus.

One of the ten commandments says, "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy", but can you imagine a law so silly that you could not do a good thing like healing someone because it was the Sabbath? Surely that was not what God meant.

Note: The "silly laws" were taken from the How Stuff Works website. They were not checked for accuracy. You may wish to choose your own examples.

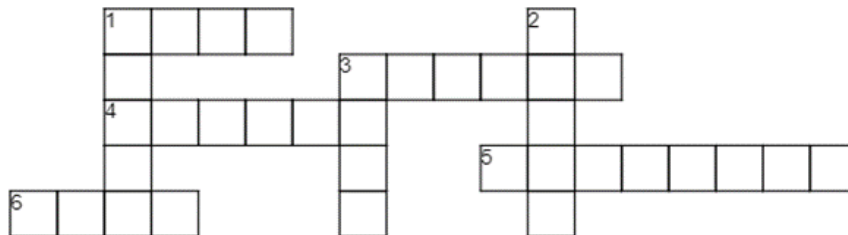
### PRAYER:

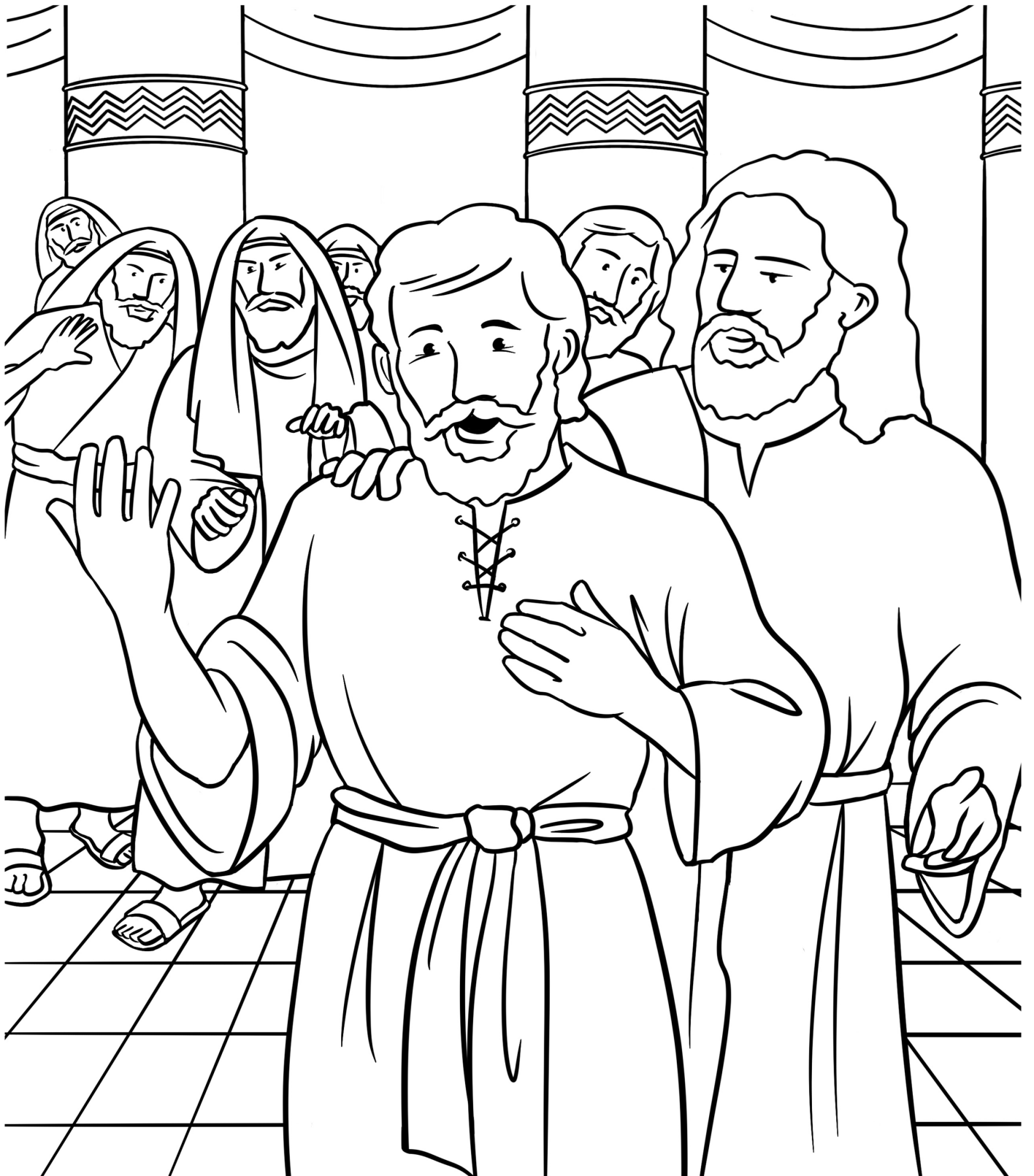

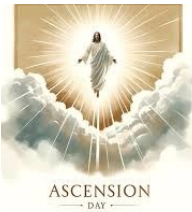
