For over two decades she has been a leader in many industry initiatives such as CommonLine processing, development of Common Record: CommonLine (CRC), and guiding it through the process to become a PESC Approved Standard. Kristi currently serves as PESC Board member since 2011 and serves on the Standards Development Forum's Steering Committee since 2009. She has been an active member on the Change Control Board (CCB) for 12 years where she is currently serving as Chair for the last 9 years. Through these leadership positions, in collaboration with the Technical Advisory Board (TAB) and as CCB Chair, Kristi is a positive influence and champion of PESC initiatives. She governs public collaboration and feedback to every PESC development workgroup and to external organizations looking to analyze and compare PESC Approved Standards to others, ensuring uniform decision-making and consistent design methodology. Throughout my career in education technology I have been a proponent of interoperability and the exchange of standards-based electronic data; and would be honored to serve on PESC's Board of Directors representing the California Community Colleges Technology Center. Funded by a grant from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office, the CCC Tech Center coordinates the work of system-wide technology projects across California's 113 community colleges, the largest system of higher education in the world. A longtime PESC member, the CCC Tech Center has contributed to and helped lead a number of PESC initiatives. At the CCC Tech Center I am the product owner for the systems transcript, articulation, and curriculum products, including the statewide transcript initiative eTranscript California (previously known as CCCTran), a past winner of PESC's Best Practices award. Prior to joining the Tech Center I was SVP Market Strategy and Chief Security and Privacy Officer at Parchment, a company that I Co-Founded as Docufide in 2004. At Parchment I led product development for its first 10 years, later leading new initiatives and supporting Parchment's growth beyond transcript exchange. During my 12+ years as a PESC member, I have participated in the workgroup that developed the HS XML transcript schema, Co-Chaired the Education Records User Group (ERUG) and Common Data Services (CDS) Taskforce, and currently serve as Chair of the EdExchange User Group, and as a member of the EdExchange Steering Committee. I previously had the honor of serving on PESC's Board of Directors representing Parchment in 2014-2015.

Tuan Anh Do serves as Director for Enrollment Management Technology going on 20 years. He oversees all the Information Technology needs for Enrollment Management and key on-campus auxiliary units. Tuan is Enrollment Management's main technical contact on a variety of systems, inclusive of being Coordinator for the Student Information System, Coordinator and Oracle DBA for Singularity Document Archive system, Oracle Application Developer, EDI Developer, ASP Web Developer and a shared resource on-campus for issues concerning Data Flow, Transformation and Integration between systems. In addition to his work at UMUC, Patrick has served for two years as Treasurer of PESC's Board of Directors, leading initiatives to update financial processes and to develop a strategic fundraising plan, and is active on the Academic Credentialing and Experiential Learning Task Force. He is also active in several American Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers chapters, including national (AACRAO), Middle States (MSACROA), and Maryland and DC (CAPACRAO) chapters.
