

Anaphylactic Shock

In reference to Bill 3, also known as Sabrina's Law 2005, new Provincial legislation was enacted January 1, 2006 to protect anaphylactic students within the school environment.

"Anaphylactic shock" is a severe allergic reaction, which may be fatal, and occurs when an allergic individual is exposed to a particular substance such as peanut products, nuts, eggs, fish, or is stung by an insect such as a bee, hornet or wasp.

Under this new law, parents/guardians and students are required to supply information on life-threatening allergies. In order to comply with this requirement, please provide the following information;
