Capnotes Educational Corner

A snapshot of WALPN's objectives includes promoting continuing education, uphold standards of care and code of ethics and to promote quality of care to protect the public.

We are glad to see that three technical colleges in WI offer a practical nurse refresher course. Fox Valley Technical College, Northeast WI Technical College, and Waukesha Technical College all offer the practical nursing refresher course. The refresher course curriculum includes nursing process, infection control, medication and pharmacology updates, trends in nursing techniques, documentation, supervision and delegation. The clinical portion of the training which varies 70-108 hours of preceptor experience in varying clinical settings make for competent nurse. Examples of clinical include hospitals, clinics, LTC, and subacute care facilities.

This opportunity of clinical locations builds a strong relationship of employer, college and student as experience is gained and relationships grow. Fox Valley and Northeast Technical both have stand-alone LPN programs. They both admit two classes per year (spring/fall). The state curriculum is designed so that students in the RN program can take the practical nursing boards after the second semester. Waukesha Technical College does not offer a LPN stand-alone program, but as other programs one can take LPN boards one year into the ADN program. WCTC also has an LPN progression program that practicing LPNs have to complete prior to entering the second year of the ADN program. All three technical colleges have great web-sites that one can go to for specifics.

Legislative Corner

It is vital that congress put people over the big drug companies. Daily in the life of the Licensed Practical Nurse one sees firsthand the struggle of 'enough money' for some people who are on Medicare to pay for their medications.

As front line workers you have a true understanding of 'real life struggles' in our world. We will all be in need of health care in our life. Common sense tells us that having the ability to get prescription medication in a timely manner and cost effective manner will not only help us feel better soon; it lessens the burden to health care industry.

We know that affordable drug prices is a priority for quality of life, economic security, and health in general. Congress currently can negotiate drug prices for those in the Veterans system and those on Medicaid, why not those on Medicare? Have you looked where those who oppose this bill get their campaign money?

If this bill would pass, the drug companies would pay a penalty when they try to price gouge patients. It also would stop the practice of charging United States patients much more money than people from other countries.

We need to preach- PEOPLE are before PROFITS. YES, in America we do have consensus on some issues; in fact 86% of public supports government negotiation for lower drug prices. 86%!!

Now is the time to take action on this non-partisan issue. You can do this by contacting:

1) Senator Ron Johnson and asking him to support this action. His phone #is: 202-224-5323. It is fine that you share real life experiences of why this bill is important. He has not stated that he supports this. You can educate.

2) Senator Tammy Baldwin has been supportive of this bill. She joined with 11 other colleagues urging them in include reforms. She was also a strong voice in the Health, Education, Labor and Pensions Committee. It was supported by Chairman Lamar Alexander (R-TN) and Ranking member Patty Murray (D-WA). Please call her office at 202-224-5653. Let her know that you are thankful she is fighting for the ability to have negotiations and realizing that the drug companies aggressive increases in drug prices make life saving treatment unaffordable in some cases.
