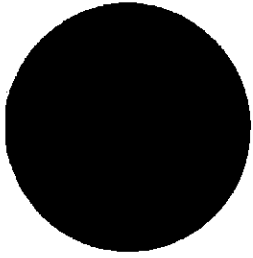



He worked hard to work with her case manager to have them interview a family in Texas. The GAL was successful at getting this family interviewed and the match process proceeded. Eliza was moved to Texas last summer. She is thriving-her feeding tube was removed, her medications reduced and she has special shoes to improve her walking. She now has a large family. If not for the GAL, this little girl would have likely aged out of foster care and faced placement in a state institution for the rest of her life. Now she has a forever family and the care she needs!

K.G., Bed & Bedding

K.G. came into care after both of her parents passed away from drug overdose. K.G. stayed with her aunt for 2 years and loved it there but her aunt has a terminal illness and was unable to adopt her. The grandmother can take K.G. but she has nowhere for her to sleep. Because of your support, K.G. was provided a bed and bedding to help ease yet another transition in her young life.

L.H., Tutoring

L.H.'s mother has significant mental health and substance abuse issues. Her father lives out of state and is out of control to the point that the Judge has hung up on him during hearings. L.H. doesn't really know her father and is frightened of him because he's gone off verbally to the foster mother during phone calls. Her mother continues a relationship with a paramour who is violent and L.H. worries so much about her mother. Her mother calls, but doesn't visit. L.H. is the sweetest child but she is struggling in school because that wasn't a focus prior to coming into foster care. Her foster mother is amazing and seeks resources for L.H. to help her succeed. L.H. participated in Camp Mariposa (for the children of addicts) and is involved in Girl Scouts and other activities. Tutoring would be beneficial not only for the rest of this school year, but throughout the summer for preparation for middle school-as she is just not prepared academically for 6th grade. Thanks to your support, L.H. received an assessment and tutoring twice a week for 6 months to get her back on track. L.H. is now doing well in school and has acclimated well to middle school and more academic responsibility.

A.L., Computer/Education

A.L. is 17 and just got accepted into college. His father is currently serving a life sentence in prison and his mother overdosed a few months ago in response to his younger brother overdosing in the past. This child has experienced a lot of hardship, but he is excelling in school. He is Captain of Color Guard, enrolled in the IB program, and works part-time about 15 hours per week. He is currently residing with a nonrelative in Gulfport until he graduates and begins college. He needs a strong laptop to assist him in school while he studies the Sciences. A.L. began college this fall and is excelling thanks to the educational support we were able to provide because of you!

D.N., Normalcy

When the GAL observed the family visit last week, they noticed the need for activity for D.N. and suggested a park setting but when I asked him last night if he has any balls to play with I found out he does not. He lit up when I suggested football/kickball. D.N. does not have any outside activities after school or weekends while living with his grandfather. He has ADHD and definitely needs to release energy and lift his spirits. D.N. is sad and confused that he cannot live with his Mom or his sister. Thanks to your support, we were able to purchase some balls for D.N. to have and play like a "normal" kid his age. Thank you!
