***MOORE RAKES IN CHAMPIONSHIP # 4***

**TIMELY 10-BAGGER SEALS THE DEAL**

In bowling, there's no such thing as an untimely 10-bagger. But some 10-bagger's seem to be remembered a lot longer. For Kendric Siders, his 10 strikes in a row to start his position round resulted in one of the bigger championships in his young career. It was those 10 strikes in a row that resulted in a 288, and that propelled him from 3rd place into the Greater Iowa Scholarship Bowling Tour Winner's Circle.

The 18 year-old from Eagle River, Alaska was making his GISBT debut this month. The right-hander was solid in his qualifying round, grabbing the #5 seed heading into match play at +121. He won his first 3 matches to surge into the lead, lost 2 of his next 3 to drop out of the lead, but heading into the position round, he trailed leader Ryan Speer by just 46 pins, and was just 5 pins behind Dawson Peterson. While Speer defeated Peterson 213-179, Sider's big finale was enough to secure the victory.

### **SIDERS BECOMES 137th TOUR CHAMPION**

This month's champion was the hottest bowler in match play, averaging 217.87 for his 8 matches, and his 6 wins and 2 losses was the best record during the finals as well. Siders raked in a big \$750 scholarship for his win. He previously won this past February's Storm Youth Championship event in Las Vegas, firing a 300 game on his way to victory. He's also been a semi-finalist in each of the past 2 years at Junior Gold, so success on the GISBT stage wasn't exactly a surprise.

Siders became the 137th different boys champion, and just the 2nd to hail from Alaska, following Jacques Kaune, of Anchorage, Alaska, who captured the May 2015 Tournament of Champions.

For his 16 games, Siders averaged 216.50. In addition to the \$750 championship check, he received the winner's plaque, and has earned a permanent place on Champion's Row. Congratulations, Kendric!

### **SPEER SNARES RUNNER-UP FINISH**

Ryan Speer was at the top of his game at the season opener. The powerful 2-hander from Beech Grove, Indiana, got his big strike ball working midway through qualifying, and snagged the #2 seed heading into the match play finals.

He was in the battle throughout the finals, and he headed into the position round with a 41-pin lead. He won his position round match, but was overtaken by the champion's final game heroics, which relegated the right-hander into the runner-up spot.

Speer enjoyed an incredibly month of July. He earned a place on Junior Team USA while competing in the U20 division at Junior Gold in front of a hometown crowd in Indianapolis. And less than 2 weeks later, he captured the biggest victory of his young career when he emerged victorious at the 2023 Teen Masters in Detroit. In Davenport, he continued that great form on his way to the runner-up showing, and he was rewarded with a \$600 scholarship for his day's work.

### **PETERSON PLACES 3rd**

Dawson Peterson enjoyed a successful event by placing 3rd. The smooth-rolling 17 year-old from Stewartville, Minnesota reeled in a \$500 scholarship for his day's work.

Peterson averaged 225.87 to finish his qualifying round at +207 and earn the high qualifier medal. He also added 10 points to his day's total (a new addition this year with boys and girls high qualifiers receiving an extra 10 points).

### **BLANEY CLAIMS 4th IN TOUR DEBUT**

Andru Blaney finished 4th at the season opener. The 2-hander from Hughesville, Maryland took home a \$400 scholarship for his performance. He was one of 3 Junior Team USA members in this month's boy's finals field (along with Ryan Speer and Zach Greim).

## **SEASON OPENER DRAWS 93 IN STAR-STUDED AFFAIR**

The 2023-2024 season opener drew an ultra-talented starting field that attracted a 93-player field that included 11 past GISBT champions, and an array of bowlers with sensational resumes.

The 14 boys and girls finalists represented 11 different states – Alaska, California, Florida, Illinois, Iowa, Indianapolis, Maryland, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska and New York.

Among the 93-player starting field were 20 bowlers making their first GISBT appearance. We welcome all of our new and returning players for another exciting season!

### **ANDRESEN TAKES 5th**

Zach Andresen made his GISBT debut a successful one. The powerful righty from Princeton, Minnesota finished in 5th place, taking home a \$350 scholarship for his efforts. Andresen was one of 4 two-handers in this month's finals field.

### **GREIM TAKES 6th**

Zach Greim was this month's 6th place finisher. The former tour champion earned a \$325 scholarship for his performance. The Poway, California native has now appeared in 6 match play finals in his career.

### **RICHARDS PLACES 7th**

Devin Richards placed 7th at the season opener. The lanky right-hander from Fort Myers, Florida was one of 4 match play finalists making their GISBT debut. He hauled in a \$300 scholarship for his day's work.

### **BIANCHI 8th IN FINALS RETURN**

Jacob Bianchi rounded out this month's boy's finals field. The talented right-hander from Altoona, Iowa was returning to the match play round for the 5th time in his career, but his first in 18 months – since he finished runner-up at the February 2022 event in Cedar Rapids. He earned a \$275 scholarship.

### **KIDWELL THRILLS THE CROWD WITH 300 IN QUALIFYING**

Noah Kidwell fired a 300 in his 7th game of qualifying, and it took him from -3 to +97. Unfortunately, he struggled during his final game, finishing with a 167, and that dropped him 3 pins behind the eventual cut number. Still, the perfect game was a career highlight, and it resulted in a 10th place tie – his highest GISBT finish.

### **GISBT OPENS SEASON # 32**

#### **NEXT EVENT SEPTEMBER 24th**

This month, the Greater Iowa Scholarship Bowling Tour (GISBT) kicked off its' 32nd season. Founded in August 1992, the season opener was the 302nd tournament in GISBT history.

Some changes this season include increased prize funds, an expansion of our Tournament of Champions field, and an increase in the points awarded to each competitor.

Last season, the top 32 boys and top 16 girls qualified for the Tournament of Champions. This season, that number increases to the top 36 boys and top 18 girls based on point standings after the March 2024 event. The 2024 Tournament of Champions will take place in April.

The points for the match play finalists have increased (see point standings at the end of this newsletter), and 10 points will also be awarded to each month's high qualifier.

Our next event will take place at Maple Lanes in Waterloo on September 24th. This event is limited to the first 84 paid and reserved entries. Please notify Eric at 563-271-2967 if you plan to compete.

## ***MOORE REELS IN TITLE # 4***

### **MOORE PULLS AWAY FOR 4th CAREER CHAMPIONSHIP**

Rachel Moore returned to the match play finals for the 19th time in her GISBT career this month. And when it was all said and done, the 18 year-old had locked up her 4th tour victory. Moore qualified on top, and maintained that lofty position throughout the match play finals. She rolled into the position round with a 97-pin advantage, and despite losing her final match, she held off a hard-charging Brynna Madison to claim the win.

Moore is the reigning Bowler of the Year, and in the season opener, she's showing no signs of relinquishing that crown. She debuted on tour at the tender age of 9 back at the October 2014 event, and over the past 9 years, we've watched as she's developed into one of the GISBT's major stars.

In the 32-season history of the GISBT, there have been 731 female competitors. Just 94 of these have captured a tour title, while only 16 of these have won more than 4 titles.

For her 14 tournament games, Moore averaged 200.50. She hauled in a \$500 scholarship for her victory, as well as the championship plaque. Congratulations, Rachel!

### **3-TIME TOUR CHAMP MADISON EARNS RUNNER-UP**

Brynna Madison staged a furious rally over her final 2 games to snare the runner-up spot. The talented right-hander from Lincoln, Nebraska finished her final 2 matches with games of 226, and then a 256-191 defeat of the eventual champ. That sensational rally took her from 187 pins behind Moore, to the final margin of defeat – which was just 18 pins.

Madison, 21, was appearing in her 15th match play finals.

### **SALZMAN 3rd IN TOUR DEBUT**

Brooke Salzman turned in an impressive performance in her GISBT debut. The right-hander from Inver Grove Heights, Minnesota hauled in a \$300 scholarship by virtue of her performance. Salzman is an impressive player who definitely merits watching in future events.

### **ULLIAN TAKES 4th**

Mackenzie Ullian returned to the match play finals for the 2nd time in her blossoming career. She finished 6th at the November 2022 event, and this time, she was in better form, finishing in 4th place. As a result of her performance, the New Lenox, Illinois resident reeled in a \$250 award.



### **WILLIAMS EARNS 5th**

Erin Williams, 21, parlayed a 5th place showing into a \$225 scholarship. The St Louis, Missouri native was appearing in the 2nd match play finals of her tour career.

### **PAST CHAMP CARR FINISHES 6th**

Elena Carr, one of 3 past GISBT champions in this month's girl's finals field, finished 6th. Carr, a 19 year-old from Hilton, New York, earned a \$200 for her performance. This was her 4th match play finals appearance.

## 2023–2024 GREATER IOWA SCHOLARSHIP BOWLING TOUR

### BOYS POINT STANDINGS AFTER 1 EVENT – 66 MEMBERS
