A Rainbow Without Colors

A couple of years ago my son, Daniel, listened to me share a homily on

Christmas during a holiday service. As might be predicted, I emphasized the importance of "keeping Christ in Christmas". If no one else was listening, Daniel surely was. As we were driving home from the meeting he said to me "Dad, you know what? Christmas without Christ is like a rainbow without colors." For obvious reasons, that statement was stunning to me. In pondering the depth of that thought I let my son know that his comment was one of the most profound statements on the holiday celebration that I had ever heard. As a matter of fact, I wished that he had shared it with me before I preached that sermon because I could have used it. (I may have even given him the credit.)

A rainbow is, in its very essence, colors and therefore a rainbow with no colors is essentially NOTHING. Unfortunately for so many people, Christmas is not a time of worship and thanksgiving for the gift of a Savior but rather, a time of personal enjoyment and nostalgic reflection. From a divine perspective, it's NOTHING.

I am reminded of the account in John 12 as certain Greeks came to celebrate Passover in Jerusalem. The purpose of this wonderful "holy day" was to celebrate the divine deliverance of the children of Israel from Egyptian bondage. The central focus of Passover was the "slain lamb" whose flesh

was eaten and whose blood was placed upon the doorways of the Israelite's homes providing "cover" from the death angel who would pass over the homes having the blood. The firstborn child would be spared from death. Passover was the most significant holiday on the Iewish calendar.

As these Greeks made their way through the hubbub in the streets of Jerusalem they were searching for something beyond the traditions. They were obviously looking for more than fun and festivities, they wanted substance, meaning and purpose. We suspect that they had heard reports about a peculiar Prophet who had worked miracles and made amazing claims. They must have

heard the rumor that this extraordinary Person would be in attendance at Passover this year. Apparently their research had discovered that Philip was known as one of His significant followers and when they encountered him they said, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus" (John 12:21). Ironically they were seeking the One who was the Fulfillment of the Passover, the Lamb who would be slain to take away the sin of the world.

As you celebrate Jesus this holiday season I hope you will give your gifts, enjoy your family, eat your feasts and sing your carols, but don't stop there. Let these activities be platforms for celebrating Christ who is the Catalyst for all of it. Pray with your family in Jesus' name, not just before the meal but have a set aside time of family devotion reflecting on the

uniqueness of the GodMan. Invite an old friend to go to lunch or breakfast and tell your salvation story, how Jesus transformed your life. Seek out a person with whom you've had conflict and reconcile with them based upon Christ's forgiveness in your life.

Don't let this Christmas be empty of its true and proper Substance. Ask God to open doors of opportunity for those around you to "See Jesus" this year in the midst of the merriment. Christ is the Rainbow of God, making visible the invisible light of the Father's glory in splendid array. John 1:14 says,

And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth."
