

Third Sunday of Lent (Year C) Sunday 20 March 2022 Lent is a second chance

My dear friends! For the Pharisees, sinners are hopeless. They are worth nothing but to be written off. Disagreeing with them, Jesus told them a little parable of a barren fig tree in which He contrasted the attitude of the vineyard owner and that of the gardener. According to vineyard owner, the barren fig tree is useless. It simply takes up space. So, chop it down! His attitude seems to be reasonable as he was more interested in fruits of the tree, than the tree itself. He had put nothing into caring for it. He didn't help the tree to become fruitful. Hence, the only option he could think of is to chop it down. The Gardener, on the other hand, has a different attitude toward the barren fig tree. As a lover of fruit trees, the barren fig tree is precious to him. Its precious not only because of what he gets out of it but also because of what he put into it to make it fruitful. He knew the fig tree is barren but he didn't give up. He sacrificed himself for it. He tried to help it by enhancing the soil. He showed tenderness and compassion in caring for the tree to enable it to bear fruit.

Reflecting on the different attitudes of the vineyard owner and the gardener toward the barren fig tree, we see clearly the way of head and the way of heart. The attitude of the vineyard owner is the way of head. He seemed sensible but overly emphasized in results. He was obsessed with power than love. Power is only interested in result, and often wants them instantly. Power has no patience with the slow or sympathy for the weak. The gardener's attitude was the way of love. Love is patient and kind. Love doesn't give up easily. Love doesn't force; it coaxes, encourages, and waits.

What is Jesus' way of treating the sinners? Unlike the Pharisees who behaved like the vineyard owner, Jesus showed the way of heart which is love. He identified himself with the sinners, befriended with them, ate and drank with them. Through His suffering and death on the cross, Jesus sacrificed Himself for the sinners that they may have life and have it in abundance. Jesus' way of love has helped many sinners, barren fig trees, left their sinful life and become fruitful trees.

As we enter into the third week of Lent, let us take this opportunity to reflect on our heavenly Father who has the heart of a Gardener. He never gives up on us. He is patient with sinners and always willing to give them a second chance. There are many examples of "fig trees" which were once barren but



after encountering Christ, the Face of God, transformed into fruitful trees, such as St Paul, St Augustine, Mary Magdalene, and many more others. In them we see clearly that no sinner is without future and no saints are without past. The reason is because **God always gives us a second chance**.





THOUGHTS FROM POPE FRANCIS

Lenten Regulations

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting and abstinence from meat.

On all other Fridays, except solemnities, the law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled by performing any one of the following:

- (a) **Prayer:** e.g., Mass attendance; family prayer; a visit to a church or chapel; reading the Bible; making the Stations of the Cross; praying the Rosary; or in other ways.
- (b) Self Denial: e.g., not eating meat; not eating sweets or dessert; giving up entertainment to spend time with the family; limiting food and drink so as to give to the poor of one's own country or elsewhere; or in other ways. Project compassion is a major means of expressing our self-denial in Australia.
- (c) **Helping Others:** e.g., special attention to someone who is poor, sick, elderly, lonely or over-burdened; or in other ways.
- * All who have completed their 18th year and have not yet begun their 60th year are bound to fast. All who have completed their 14th year are bound to abstain. (Canon 1252)
- * The Season of Lent is a time of penance. During Lent the faithful are exhorted to devote themselves in a special manner to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, and to deny themselves.
- * Each of the faithful is obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled between Ash Wednesday, 2 March 2022 and Trinity Sunday 12 June 2022 unless for a good reason it is fulfilled at another time during the year.
- * The wonderful gift of the Lord's merciful love is offered in a special way in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Lent is a most appropriate time to receive this Sacrament. All faithful who have reached the age of discretion are bound faithfully to confess their grave sins at least once a year.

FIRST READING

Exodus 3:1-8,13-15

Moses was looking after the flock of Jethro, his father-in-law priest of Midian. He led his flock to the far side of the wilderness and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There the angel of the Lord appeared to him in the shape of a flame of fire, coming from the middle of a bush. Moses looked: there was the bush blazing but it was not being burnt up. 'I must go and look at this strange sight,' Moses said, 'and see why the bush is not burnt.' Now the Lord saw him go forward to look, and God called to him from the middle of the bush. 'Moses, Moses!' he said. 'Here I am,' Moses answered. 'Come no nearer,' he said. 'Take off your shoes, for the place on which you stand is holy ground. I am the God of your fathers,' he said, 'the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob.' At this Moses covered his face, afraid to look at God.

And the Lord said, 'I have seen the miserable state of my people in Egypt. I have heard their appeal to be free of their slave-drivers. Yes, I am well aware of their sufferings. I mean to deliver them out of the hands of the Egyptians and bring them up out of that land to a land rich and broad, a land where milk and honey flow, the home of the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Amorites, the Perizzites, the Hivites and the Jebusites.'

Then Moses said to God, 'I am to go, then, to the sons of Israel and say to them, "The God of your fathers has sent me to you." But if they ask me what his name is, what am I to tell them?' And God said to Moses, 'I Am who I Am. This' he added 'is what you must say to the sons of Israel: "I Am has sent me to you." And God also said to Moses, 'You are to say to the sons of Israel: "The Lord, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you." This is my name for all time; by this name I shall be invoked for all generations to come.' The Word of the Lord **All: Thanks be to God.**

They were all baptised into Moses in this cloud and in this sea; all ate the same spiritual food and all drank the same spiritual drink, since they all drank from the spiritual rock that followed them as they went, and that rock was Christ. In spite of this, most of them failed to please God and their corpses littered the desert.

These things all happened as warnings for us, not to have the wicked lusts for forbidden things that they had. You must never complain: some of them did, and they were killed by the Destroyer.

All this happened to them as a warning, and it was written down to be a lesson for us who are living at the end of the age. The man who thinks he is safe must be careful that he does not fall.
