### **General Scarlett Fountain**

A farewell gift to Portsmouth by General Sir James Yorke Scarlett who led the successful charge of the Heavy Brigade at Balaclava during the Crimean War. It was built of Portland stone and stood 20 feet high with surmounted by an illuminated glass globe. Bronzed iron dolphins, vases and shells spouted at

the corners and set in four panels were the arms of the Borough of Portsmouth and General Scarlett. It stood opposite Clarence Pier north of the statue of Wellington. It was constructed by Mr Baker of Marmion Road.
