Although some folks left, it was an excited crowd that stayed to enjoy the food and company.




Today heavy equipment and teams of workmen have been seen busy at work at the site. We will obviously be updating everyone with any new information and developments news of available.

Don't Feed the Bears

Human nature can lead us to believe that when we feed wild animals we are helping them. In reality we are causing them more harm than good. In light of recent events, the NM Dept. of Game and Fish reminds people that it is never acceptable to feed bears or other wildlife. This can cause bears to display non-typical behavior.

"Bears that become acclimated to receiving food from humans can become dangerous and aggressive toward people," reminds director Alexandra Sandoval.



If you encounter a bear:

Stop and back away slowly while facing the bear. Avoid direct eye contact (may be considered a threat). Do not run. Make yourself appear large by holding out your jacket. If you have small children, pick them up so they don't run.

- ➤ Give the bear plenty of room to escape, so it doesn't feel threatened or trapped. If a black bear attacks you, fight back using anything at your disposal, such as rocks, sticks, binoculars or even your bare hands. Aim for the bear's nose and eyes.
- ➤ If the bear has not seen you, stay calm and slowly move away, making noise so the bear knows you are there. Never get

between a mother bear and her cubs.


Canning Traditions

Canning season is in full swing. This is invaluable information that most "experienced" canners know, but for those of us relatively new to the process (less than 20 years), here's some helpful tips.

Meter Tampering Can Kill

Tampering with your electric meter can cost you your life. No, the crime won't land you on death row when Socorro Electric (SEC) – whose meter readers and

servicemen are trained to spot electricity theft – reports you to the Sheriff's office. In that case, you might be charged with theft, possibly sent to jail and slapped with fines of about triple the money you thought you might save by rigging your meter.

Needless to say, any attempt to bypass or alter an electric meter can result in shock, fire, explosion, or electrocution. If you are lucky enough not to get hurt, you'll still leave the tampered meter in a state that's dangerous to others. including the SEC employee who reads or maintains it. Plus, you are driving up electrical costs for your neighbors, just as shoplifters force department stores to inflate the price of their clothes to cover theft.

SEC does not have to catch you red-handed to turn you over to the authorities. In fact, the law assumes that a person who benefits from the use of stolen electricity has tampered with the meter.

Please, leave the meters to the professionals. Besides, it's not worth risking your life over.
