May Presenter: Robin Long

Monday, May 24 Zoom Lecture: "Modern Mariner's Compass – Strip Pieced!"

What started as a quest to make a Mariner's Compass quilt for her submarine officer husband, Robin Long took an idea she had in 1992 and launched Robin Ruth Design in January, 2015. She has developed a new line of revolutionary rulers, books, patterns and technique for making STRIP-PIECED mariner's compass blocks in16 sizes – that's right, NO PAPER PIECING!

This system of rulers begins with the Skinny Robin 16-Point and Fat Robin 16-Point Mariner's Compass Book and Ruler combos; each used to create slightly different mariner's compass blocks in 16 sizes (from 6"-36") using the exact same process. This revolutionary strippiecing method enables you to make the once tedious and unapproachable mariner's compass block quickly and accurately. 


Patricia finishes with a show of her own quilts, made with vintage Japanese cottons, and talks about how these special fabrics inspired her. www.okanarts.com
