THE PASTOR'S CORNER

According to the data from PewResearch Center more than 60 percent of U.S. Christians do not attend church on a weekly basis. In short, millions of people who consider themselves Christians often limit their church attendance largely to holidays, weddings and funerals. With all the activities at Chapel Hill I wanted you to know why it's important to be involved in church:

- 1. Church involvement is evidence that you're a Christian in the first place. It also helps keep you from abandoning the faith. According to the author of Hebrews, the antidote to developing an "unbelieving heart" that leads you "to fall away from the living God" is to "exhort one another" (Hebrews 3:12) -- an activity that occurs most prominently in the church.
- 2. Gathering with a church encourages believers to love others and do good deeds (Hebrews 10:24).
- 3. A church is the main venue for using your spiritual gifts (1 Corinthians 12:1). God has given you abilities and talents intended to help other Christians. If you're not involved in a church, others are being deprived of what you have to offer.
- 4. A church helps you defend Christianity against those who attack it. When Jude told the early Christians to "contend for the faith" (Jude 1:3), he directed his instruction toward a group of believers, not a scattering of lone-ranger Christians. Answering challenges from coworkers, friends and family members is always easier when you can ask fellow church members for help and wisdom.
- 5. A church is a great venue for pooling resources to support missions and benevolent works (2 Corinthians 8:1; 3 John

- 1:5). Your money combined with that of fellow church members can do a lot for Christ.
- 6. A church helps its members maintain correct doctrine (1 Timothy 1:15). You might begin to adopt unbiblical ideas without realizing it yourself. But you probably won't adopt unbiblical ideas without someone at your church realizing it, and they can help you get back to the truth.
- 7. After your family, a church is the best group of people to meet your physical needs in an emergency (1 John 3:16; 1 Timothy 5:3).
- 8. A church supports you when you face persecution (Acts 4:23; Acts 12:12). You may not be imprisoned for your Christian beliefs like the apostles were, but a church family is still a great source of comfort when you face stinging words or unfair treatment.
- 9. A church is where you can be baptized and take part in the Lord's Supper (Matthew 28:18; 1 Corinthians 11:17; Ephesians 4:4). These two sacraments are a vital part of any believer's walk with Jesus.
- 10. A church provides the setting for corporate worship (Ephesians 5:19; Colossians 3:16). Though it's a blessing to praise God alone, there is a unique joy that accompanies singing God's praises with an entire congregation of Christ followers.

There are so many ways to be involved at Chapel Hill and our ministry fair on September 11th will help you learn more of the opportunities to be involved and serve God.

The Book of Discipline states "All Christians are called to minister wherever Christ would have them serve and witness in deeds and words that heal and free"

Responsibilities of the Lay Leader:

A BACK-TO-SCHOOL SURVIVAL GUIDE FOR MOMS

Don't just survive the school season—thrive! Take heart with these tips.

While most moms look forward to sending their kids back to school, we don't always enjoy the return of a full schedule and a full plate. It's easy for stress levels to rise—getting the kids into new routines, helping with homework, driving to afterschool lessons and practices, as well as keeping up with church activities. But take heart! There are ways to make time for you during these busy back-to-school days.

1. Enjoy the quiet.

Whether you're an early morning riser or you prefer a later bedtime, making time each day for yourself while the kids are in bed can give you the spiritual recharge you need. Keep the television or radio off and pull out your Bible or an inspiring devotional or book and spend a few minutes reconnecting with God. Ask yourself this question: How can I embrace today?

2. Mix fitness with friends.

Drop off the kids at school or put them on the school bus and meet a friend for a quick 30-minute walk or an aerobics class at your local community center.

3. Use the car line to your advantage.

If you pick up your child from school, consider arriving 45

minutes to an hour early to park and use that time to relax and refocus. I know many moms who will keep a book or favorite magazine to read during this time or catch up on phone calls with friends. You can also use these spare minutes to work on a Bible study.

4. Speaking of Bible studies ...

Many churches launch their new Bible study classes in the fall. If your church does not offer these types of classes, then look at other churches in your community who do and consider signing up for one. Quite often, classes are offered on a wide range of topics as well as days and nights and times of the week that will fit your busy schedule. Not only will you receive spiritual encouragement, but you may also meet new friends!

5. Form your own breakfast club.

Invite four or five other moms to join you once a week for coffee or breakfast after the kids are at school. If some of you still have little ones at home, consider meeting at a fast-food chain with a playground. Make it a regular weekly appointment on your schedule to reconnect and discover that you're not as alone (or crazy) as you thought you were.
