"HUMILITY"

Having grown up in a South suburb of Chicago that was near the Indiana state line and having served a UCC church for 11 years in Northwest Indiana, I remember that on any given Sunday in those parts one would see dozens of school buses, some rather rickety looking, bearing the inscription: "First Baptist Church, Hammond, Indiana," and then underneath, "World's Largest Sunday School."

They were probably right. Their fleet of buses, drivers, and mechanics was larger than most school districts. They would pick up kids on regular routes all over the metropolitan area, including the South side of Chicago. Some parents probably liked it because they'd have their Sundays to themselves – free baby-sitting. Kids liked it – they met new friends and had something to do. I heard there were always prizes or giveaways. One year the church distributed live baby chicks at Easter, thousands of them, and got the ASPCA up in arms because of it. What are urban, inner-city, and suburban kids going to do with baby chicks?

First Baptist Church may have done a lot of good with their Sunday School busing program. But the motto "World's Largest Sunday School" was bothersome to many. I remember a Lutheran pastor saying something to the effect: Is the aim of this church to bring children to Christ or is it an ego trip? It seems that they're saying: "We're the First Baptist Church and we're #1, the World's Largest Sunday School. Hooray for us!"

Does this reaction appear overly judgmental? Does this motto better reflect the values of the world, which often focuses on size and fame, rather than on kingdom values?

The end of Lent is here...and with it: Holy Week. For me, this time in the church calendar is a lesson in humility. The humble Christ entering Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, not on a white charger as a military hero but on a donkey as the sacrificial Saviour of all. The humble Christ washing the disciples' feet in the Upper Room on Maundy Thursday and offering himself as spiritual food in the first Sacrament of Holy Communion. The humble Christ fulfilling the prophecy as the suffering servant on Good Friday. The humble women who found the empty tomb on Easter morning, looking not for a miracle but for a dead friend whose body they would lovingly prepare for burial. But amidst the power-hungry Jewish leaders, the humble Christ and his humble followers realized a victory that was out of this world!

We need to be careful, as a church and as individuals, that we not get caught up in the world's definition of success: size, power, and superiority. For us as Christians, Jesus is our example of victory. By his resurrection he defeated the last and greatest fear of so many: death. And he did it humbly, on a cross. Holy Week was the path that led him there...and beyond.

Please take special note of the Holy Week worship services described elsewhere in The Sentinel: Palm Sunday at 10:15 a.m., Maundy Thursday simple meal at 6:30 p.m., worship at 7:00 p.m. and Good Friday (just added) at 7:00 p.m., and Easter Sunday at 7:00 a.m. and 10:15 a.m. I urge you to attend each of these special days and nights in order to receive the full meaning and blessing from Holy Week.

Let us journey together through Holy Week, to the cross and beyond – to the empty tomb! Come humbly and experience the awe and meaning of our Holy Week services at St. John's.

WHERE DOES IT ALL GO?



Heating

The heating system original cost was \$164,900. Since demolition was done by church volunteers, we received a reduction of \$2,500 from Earl Mechanical. This puts the system cost at \$162,400.

As of February 26, we have generated \$154,872.88 (audit team to confirm) towards the total of \$162,400. Many thanks for your generosity. This gives us an outstanding balance of \$7,527.12.

We (Consistory) cashed in an \$11,025.54 CD that matured with the Henry County Bank last Fall and utilized it to make a payment to Earl Mechanical last November. This dollar amount IS NOT included in the \$154,872.88. The CD money is considered by Consistory to be a loan, with expectations that it will be paid back to ourselves in full.

Roofs

In calendar year 2022, we spent almost \$8,100 in roof repairs. The flat roof was patched and a small area was replaced. We incurred wind damage to the roof on Fellowship Hall and repairs were made. We put a deposit down with Durable Slate to replace 75 slates and repair the flashing on the bell tower.

This year (February) we paid the balance due to Durable Slate of \$7,100. At the last Consistory meeting, a motion was approved to take \$5,000 from the COVID funds to replace more slates. The new slates will be black in color. These will be new as the slates we have been using are reclaimed and new ones of that color are scarce. We plan to continue to work with Durable Slate to replace damaged slates.

Parking Lot

Cracks that were greater than .25 inch were resealed for almost \$1,200.

Utilities

Electricity, propane, internet, phones, etc. cost almost \$28,000 for calendar year 2022.

Taxes and Insurance

\$8,629

Office Supplies


Copier, paper, toner, postage, and other items for calendar year 2022, cost was \$11,000.

As you can see, I have not mentioned any monies for the staff, custodian supplies, Sunday school materials, mission giving, and many more items.

It is amazing that we have, in less than a year, almost amassed the necessary funds to pay for all of the projects and keep the rest of our financial commitments fulfilled.

It takes a huge financial obligation to maintain our facilities, and I commend each and every one of you.

CONSISTORY HIGHLIGHTS

March 13, 2023

Welcome aboard! Tyler Rue is officially our Financial Administrator.

Recommendation to close the line of credit for the Heating Fund at Civista Bank, approved

Motion to pay all but \$10,000 of the bill to Earl's Mechanical for the heating system, approved. The balance is being held until the faulty sensor has been replaced. The delay has been due to supply chain issues.

Recommendation to use \$5,000 from the COVID-19 funds to replace 75 slates on the roof in 2023, as recommended in 2022. On recommendation of the Trustees and Deacons, Consistory agreed to change to new North Country slates which are a true black product rather than continuing to use the reclaimed (used) slates that match the current roof. With pricing being the same for new or used, the decision was to change to the better quality product. If the cost exceeds \$5,000, the balance to be paid from Major Maintenance Funds. Motion approved.

Recommendation for Consistory to take over the Easter Breakfast with the help of the CE Board, with proceeds going to the Summer Faith Family Activities, Approved.

Pastor presented a letter he had composed to be sent to those members who have not been active in the church for two or more years. Back door of the kitchen entrance will be replaced. Just waiting on measurements from the vendor.

Certificate of Insurance is now needed for any vendors working in the church (required by our insurance carrier).

Holy Week begins on **Palm Sunday**, April 2. Our focus is on the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, where he was greeted with shouts of "Hosanna!" Our choir will sing and will be joined by Sunday School children in a special processional. Palm branches will be distributed to add to the festive atmosphere of worship. We will not have Communion this day because of participating in the Sacrament three times later in the week.

On **Maundy Thursday**, April 6, we remember Jesus' gathering with his disciples in the Upper Room for the Last Supper. The evening will begin at 6:30 p.m. with a simple meal in the Fellowship Hall. Then at 7:00 p.m. we'll remain in place and transition into a special service to include Communion, Candlelight, and Tenebrae (shadows) and the gradual extinguishing of candles. The choir will sing for this worship gathering.

Our thoughts turn to the crucifixion of Jesus when we worship in our Sanctuary on **Good Friday**, April 7, at 7:00 p.m. This is a new worship opportunity at St. John's since there will not be a Community Service. We will focus on Jesus sealing our redemption on the cross and hear his Seven Last Words from the cross. A special feature of this service will be the use of pictures to show Jesus' journey from Maundy Thursday to Good Friday to Easter.

Sadness is turned to joy and the resurrection promise is fulfilled as we worship and celebrate together on the holiest day of the year - Easter Sunday, April 9. The morning will begin with all being invited to gather outside at 7:00 a.m. for sunrise over the cemetery (at 7:07), after which we'll assemble indoors in the sanctuary for our Sunrise Service, which will include Communion. At 8:00 a.m. or after the Sunrise Service, we are all invited to enjoy the return of our annual Easter Breakfast in the Fellowship Hall. Then Sunday School students and all who are interested are invited to go back into the sanctuary at 9:00 a.m. for music and a special Easter program. After this the kids will be taken outside for an Easter Egg Hunt and Easter Basket Raffle - parents and all members are invited to watch! Our second Easter Service (different from the Sunrise Service) with Communion at 10:15 a.m. will be in the sanctuary and will include a choir anthem. Come and celebrate the resurrection amidst the special Scriptures, hymns, and Easter garden of flowers in and around the Chancel. Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

Parents, Guardians, and Grandparents - please let the office know if you have a student who will be graduating from High School, College or completing other educational milestones. We like to recognize these achievements during May each year and count on the graduate or their family to let us know.



St. John's Faith Family Can Help

Reminder to the St. John's Faith Family - People sometimes hit a hard stretch - it could be an unexpected layoff, an illness that results in medical bills or time off work, breakdown of a vehicle or major appliance, an especially high utility bill, an increase in rent or other payments. We recognize that it is often difficult to ask for help but remember that God doesn't want people to be stressed. The St. John's Faith Family is prepared to help our folks in two ways and there is a process for St. John's folks to protect their privacy and dignity.

The Shalom Food Pantry exists to help anyone in need of food with no questions asked. You do not need to come in during the regular Shalom distribution times when other people are around. In situations like this, the only record that is kept is that "a family of (#) received food." Your name is not attached to any record. If you contact Pastor Voll or Betty (Bob) Rettig, either one will arrange for you to come in at a time when you can pick up food at a time that works best for you. No one else needs to know.

There have been folks who have found themselves behind on a rent or utility payment, a doctor's bill, car payment or something similar. Our Love Gift fund exists to help people in situations like this. Any member can request a Love Gift once in a calendar year. Contact the Pastor if a Love Gift would help you or your family.

St. John's has been blessed to have generous donors. Shalom is most happy when they can share the food they have with those in need. The Love Gift Fund has been a blessing with those in need. There are no strings attached and people involved are dedicated to maintaining confidentiality.
