I am visually impaired and grew up receiving services through the Center for the Visually Impaired in Atlanta. This is what initially ignited my passion for nonprofit organizations. When I was 14, I attended GLO

nonprofit organizations. When I was 14, I attended GLCB as a camper, and fell in love with the camp. Since then, I worked as a summer camp counselor for various summer camps.

I received my bachelor's degree from Georgia State University in Nonprofit Leadership and Management. Since graduation, I have worked as a Children and Youth Services Instructor at the Center for the Visually Impaired. I also began a Graduate program to receive my Teacher of the Visually Impaired Certification last year. I have worked with blind/visually impaired children from ages 2-22. I have a strong passion for promoting the independence of blind/visually impaired people and assisting them develop the skills they need to succeed at all stages of their life.

I believe that one of the biggest ways to set a blind person up for success is to build confidence. This is why I was so excited to get the opportunity to work with Lions Camp last year! I know firsthand that Lions Camp gives blind people the confidence they need to be as independent as their sighted counterparts by providing a space to try new things, have adventures, and build relationships.

Although last summer did not go as planned, I did join the advisory committee for GLC Inc. and am excited to continue to work with camp this year. There is power in learning you can do something you never thought you could, and I am so thrilled to get to be a part of imparting that on the GLC campers this year!

The Board and Lions approved the appoint of the Trustees. The Trustees serve a two year term and are responsible for managing the Georgia Lions Camp's investments.

Chairman Paul will immediately begin planning his year in office and will be working having committee positions filled with volunteers that want to help the camp grow.

PAUL MAY GEORGIA LIONS CAMP VICE CHAIRMAN 2019-2021

Paul has been a member of the Milledgeville Lions club for 33 years. He was District Governor of 18F in 2010-2011 and MD-18 Council Chair from 2015-2016. Prior to that he was the district treasurer for 5 years and Georgia Lions Camp Treasurer for 6 years. He has attended the Southeastern Lions Leadership Institute and has attended seven USA/Canada forums and seven Lions International Conventions.

He and his wife, Lion Mary Anne, have been married for 53 years. They have two grown children. Paul is originally from Atlanta and graduated from Ga. Tech. He worked for large corporations for 20 years. And then he and his wife owned their own business, American Fast Photo, for 23 years. Paul now spends most of his time doing Lions, Soup Kitchen and church work. They are members of the First United Methodist Church of Milledgeville. He has worked on 4 Habitat houses.

Paul was a Guiding Lion for the Eatonton Lions Club. The Milledgeville Lions Club awarded Paul a Melvin Jones Fellow and three Lion of the Year awards. He has received two President's Certificates of Appreciation and two President's Leadership Award. In 2012 he was honored with the Ervin/Crumbley Award. To fulfill our motto of "WE SERVE", Paul has a strong desire to serve Lions at the club, the district and state level.

Changes to the camp awards was approved and is included in this newsletter. Both Lioness awards and the Chairman's award were discontinued.

The remaining awards were left in place with a change in the distribution and the style of the award. Now all State Level Awards will be a plaque presented at the State Convention and District Awards will be a certificate and banner patch presented at the first cabinet meeting of each district by their District Director.

The contest period for awards from the camp is from May 1 to April 30 of the following year. For a donation to be included in the Contest Period, the donation must be received at the Georgia Lions Camp by April 30. If not, it will roll over into the next Contest Period.

This was necessary because the awards have to be calculated and prepared so they may be presented at the State Convention which is generally in May or June.

In kind donation will be acknowledged but they do not apply to Contest Period. The value of the item is to be determined by the donor and not the camp nor does the camp need a value.

AWARDS AND RECOGNITION

The Georgia Lions Camp Inc. Issues awards and recognition for the State and District Levels, based on the contest period from May 1st to April 30th of the following year. State level awards are presented by the Camp Chairman at the State Convention. District level awards are presented by your District Director at the first Cabinet Meeting.

State Level Awards:

Dr. C.M. Blanton Award	Presented to the District governor for the highest per capita contribution.
Thomas T. Purvis Award	Presented to the Club President with the highest per capita contribution in first and second place standings.
Don Anderson Award	Presented to the Club President for the highest increase per capita contribution over the previous year for both first and second place standings.
Keep the Camp Fires Burning	Presented to the Club President for the highest total donation per capita for "Keep the camp Fires Burning" in first and second place standings
Treasurer's Award	Presented to the Club President with the highest total dollar contribution for both first and second place standings.

District Level Awards:

Highest Per Capita Award	Presented to the Club President for each of the four Districts.	
R.C. Cunningham Service Award	Presented to the Club President with the most man-hours worked at the Camp; by dividing the number of hours by the number of members per Club. Amended to include travel time to and from the Camp when working at the Camp as follows: • Districts L & I - 14 hrs. round trip per Member. • Districts N & O - 6 hrs. round trip per Member	
Hank and Doy Barks Leo Service Award	Presented to the LEO Club within each District for the most service rendered to the Camp during the current Lions Year. (This service can be rendered at the Camp, in the local Community or any location as long as it benefits the Camp.) Deadline for applying for this award is April 30th of each Lions Year.	

Individual Achievement Awards:

Century Club Key Holder Award	Plaque and Annual Medallion recognizing individual commitment as a Century Club Member. Levels of membership are: Diamond Key Holder - \$1000 per Year Gold Key Holder - \$500 per Year Silver Key Holder - \$250 per Year Bronze Key Holder - \$100 per Year
Dr. C.M. Blanton Fellow Award**	Certificate presented to individuals of Clubs that contribute \$300 to the Camp in honor of or in memory of a person who has made an outstanding contribution to the Camp.
Founders Award**	Plaque presented to individuals or Clubs that contribute \$500 to the Camp in honor of or in memory of a person who has made an outstanding contribution to the Camp.
1976 Society	Certificate presented to individual Society members who agree to contribute \$19.76 per month for a year. Total \$237.12 (can be paid once for the total amount)
Patches	Awarded to clubs annually based upon the average dollar amount donated to the camp per club member. The patch indicating the year and the bar representing donation amount are presented at the State Convention. \$100.00 contribution - a diamond award patch; \$75.00 contribution - a gold award patch; \$50.00 contribution - a silver award patch; \$25.00 contribution - a bronze award patch

The following projects will be updated monthly in our camp newsletter. If you see a project that you or your club would be interested in helping with, please email your interest to <u>director@glcb.org</u>.

- 1. Paint post at Arts and Crafts building
- 2. Paint Porch on Arts and Crafts Building
- 3. Some minor sheetrock repair in kitchen serving area and then paint ceiling
- 4. Paint entry sidewalks at the exit doors to the bunkhouse.
- 5. Repair Emergency exit door at restrooms in the Dining Hall.
- 8. Repair damaged handrails leading to the floating dock.
- 9. Paint the railing around the playground
- 10. Limbs on oak tree located at the rear entrance of the kitchen need to be trimmed (this may have to be done by a professional to prevent damage to the roof)
- 11. Memorial Garden, there are sections that need new flowers.
- 12. Clean and paint swing frames at the fire pit area.
- 13. Swings at the fire pit need to be painted.
- 14. Some areas of screens at the bar-b-que shelter needs to be re-stapled.
- 15. Pressure wash Administration Building.
- 16. Paint water heater room located behind the newly renovated Staff Building.
- 17. Paint the pump house at the pond
- 18. Paint the Water Tank
- 19. Interior Dining Hall to be repainted
- 20. Kitchen serving area needs walls to be painted
- 21. Kitchen paint to match serving area.
- 22. Nature Trail clean up debris. To build up low lying areas we need Three loads of crushed asphalt and Two loads of fill dirt.
- 23. Remove soiled carpet from (Rental House) (Directors house)
- 24. (Rental House) Replace carpet with either laminate flooring or ceramic tile Camp has some tile-enough to do maybe three of the four rooms.
- 25. Install gates at two entrances to camp located near Main Dormitory: these are 28' openings and what is called cattle gates would be sufficient. Gates needed.
- 26. Wooden picnic tables need repairs or replacing.
